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Literacy	Reading Our class novel is 'The Explorer'	<ul> <li>We are developing a range of skills and strategies to help us read and understand texts. In particular we will be developing our ability to find and use information in non-fiction texts and to begin to recognise persuasive techniques such as word choice and repetition. We will also continue to build our understanding of inference.</li> <li>We will use these skills to answer 'Literacy Key' tasks: the focus of our learning this term will be finding information in non-fiction texts using skimming, scanning and the Contents and Index pages, identifying the purpose and main idea of a text, recognising how sources try to influence our opinion and recognising the difference between fact and opinion.</li> <li>We are learning to extend our vocabulary by finding out the meaning of words linked to our reading, spelling and social studies learning and create a range of questions, using higher order thinking.</li> </ul>
	Writing	<ul> <li>We are learning to create functional texts, focusing on persuasive texts.</li> <li>We are learning to organise ideas using notes: summarising, sequencing and presenting information.</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>We are learning to edit, proof-read and up-level our writing.</li> </ul>

Listening & Talking	<ul> <li>In Grammar we are learning about the Parts of Speech, openers and conjunctions and plurals.</li> <li>We are extending our vocabulary through learning about synonyms and antonyms and developing our dictionary and thesaurus skills.</li> <li>We are developing our use of 'Tier 2' vocabulary through QI Writing.</li> <li>We are learning to take part in discussion, listening and sharing our ideas.</li> <li>We are create and answer literal, inferential and evaluative questions about what we listen to or watch.</li> <li>We are learning to identify facts and opinions.</li> <li>We are learning to recognise the ways in which some sources may try to influence our opinion.</li> </ul>
Numeracy	<ul> <li>We are learning to use a variety of mental and written addition and subtraction strategies and to apply them to word problems (including, for some pupils, with decimals)</li> <li>We are developing our use of multiplication and division strategies, including using written methods.</li> <li>Some pupils are learning to apply the correct order of operations in number calculations.</li> <li>We are learning about multiples and factors.</li> <li>We are continuing to use Sumdog to improve our mental maths fluency at our own level.</li> <li>We are continuing to develop our fluency and speed in mental calculations.</li> <li>We are learning about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes, including calculating their area and perimeter.</li> </ul>
Social Studies We will finish our rainforest topic during the first part of term, then base our topic learning around The Theatre in the latter part of term.	• We are learning to compare the lifestyle and culture of citizens in Scotland with another country,
