We are learning to apply the correct order of operations in number calculations. We are learning about multiples, factors and primes. We are continuing to use Sumdog to improve our mental maths fluency at our own level. We are continuing to develop our fluency and speed in mental calculations. We are learning about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes, including drawing shapes with a given perimeter and calculating the area of right-angled |
