<p>Literacy</p>	<p>Reading</p> <p><i>Our class novel this term is 'Friend or Foe' by Michael Morpurgo. This will link with our topic learning about the Second World War</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are continuing to develop our skills in reading aloud, focusing on using punctuation clues and our understanding of dialogue to promote fluency and expression. • We are learning to discuss our preferred texts, beginning to comment on the author's choice of language. • We are learning to set personal targets to develop our reading. • We are developing skills and strategies to help us read and understand texts. In particular we will be learning to discuss setting, plot, characters and point of view, to identify the writer's style and to discuss structure of a given text.
	<p>Writing</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning to write narrative texts, focusing on description of character and setting, plot and structure. • We are continuing to develop our spelling at our own level and apply it to all areas of literacy. • We will continue to develop our use of punctuation through QI. • We are developing our use of punctuation for direct speech. • We are learning to form letters correctly, join and present our work neatly in handwriting. • In Grammar we are developing our understanding of synonyms and antonyms, apostrophes (for possession and contractions), speech marks, syllabification and paragraphing. • We are learning to use a thesaurus to support the use of a varied vocabulary. • We are learning to uplevel pieces of writing, such as

		through adding adjectives and more complex vocab.
	Listening & Talking	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning to discuss our preferences and give a personal response to texts, including relevant and linked details • We are developing our presentation skills through the use of 'pecha kucha' presentations, discussing eye contact, body language and pace, use of language and vocabulary.
Numeracy		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning to order negative numbers. • We are continuing to develop our use of addition and subtraction- mental and written. • We are learning about multiplication and division, using both mental and written methods. • We are learning to recognise multiples and factors. • We are learning independently collect, organise, display and interpret information using bar graphs, tables and charts. • We are learning to analyse and draw conclusions from data. • We are learning to create bar graphs using digital technologies.
Social Studies Topic: Britain at War (World War 2)		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning about the Second World War. • We are learning to use primary and secondary sources to research the past. • We are learning to compare and contrast society in the past with our own daily lives. • We're learning about the influence and impact of people and events of the past. • Please note: while P6 and P7 children will learn about the Holocaust as part of our topic, P4 and P5 children will not- other than a general mention that Hitler was very cruel to Jewish people. The details of what this involved are more appropriate to be learned further up the school. I will note that the P4/5s haven't covered this yet so that they do have the opportunity before they leave Kingsbarns.
Health & Wellbeing, including PE		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Through the sports of badminton and volleyball, we are learning to create rules to follow in a game, use tactics to serve, block or position our bodies correctly for a shot, and work well with a partner. • We will be developing our control and team work through hockey. • In creative dance, we will learn some of the famous dances of the WW2 era, and use our topic learning to inspire our own creations. • We are learning to give and act on feedback • We are learning about fire safety and prevention and

	<p>winter water safety.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We are learning about metacognition and how our brains learn with Miss Leverage (University of St Andrews ID 4001 student) Through our Pupils Leadership Groups, we are learning to contribute to our community, bringing about positive change. Through discussions about rationing and 'Dig for Victory', we are learning about food seasonality, availability and sustainability. We are learning to prepare food hygienically.
