Literacy	Reading Our class novel currently is 'The Silver Sword' by Ian Serraillier. This has linked in with our topic learning about World War 2.	 We are continuing to develop our skills in reading aloud with expression and understanding, using punctuation and grammar clues to help. Some pupils will continue to develop strategies to decode tricky words. We are learning to find key information in fiction and non-fiction texts (using the contents page, skim and scan, headings and diagrams to locate information). We are learning to make notes under given headings. We are learning to respond to and create questions about texts to show our understanding. We are learning to recognise the difference between fact and opinion.
	Writing	 We are learning to write information reports, newspaper reports and procedural texts. We are continuing to develop our spelling at our own level, using phonics and spelling strategies. We will continue to develop our tools for writing through QI, continuing our focus on punctuation and adding in a new aim part way through the term. We are learning to form letters correctly, join and present our work neatly in handwriting. In Grammar, we are learning about commas, homophones, simile and metaphor. We are learning to take notes to help plan our writing. We will use our notes to create new texts.
	Listening & Talking	 We are developing our use of features of spoken language (pace, gesture, expression and emphasis) through learning, presenting and giving feedback on our Scottish poems. We are learning to communicate clearly and audibly. We are learning how to make notes under given

	 We are experiencing the joy of performance through our Scottish Showcase and Fife Festival of Music trip. We are learning to sing and perform Scottish music. We are learning about Scottish music, responding and sharing our thoughts and feelings. We are learning to use our voice and musical instruments to experiment with sounds, pitch, and rhythm through listening to some Rock Anthems. Dance (See PE)
	 We are learning to create roles, experimenting with movement, expression and voice. We are learning to create and present drama. We are learning to give and accept constructive criticism.
RME	 We are learning about Sikhism- the lives and teachings of significant figures, moral values, forms of worship and artefacts, major life events and times of year, and festivals and celebrations. We are finishing our work on Christianity from last term by learning about parables, and will also learn about why Christians celebrate Easter.
Digital Literacy/technology	 We are learning to use digital technologies to search for information. We are learning about responsible digital behaviour and how to keep ourselves safe. We are learning how to build simple programmes to carry out a given task.
Languages	 We are developing our knowledge of French vocabulary for colours, birthdays and where we are from. We are learning to ask questions and share information about ourselves. We are learning about France, discussing similarities

	 and differences between Scotland and France. We will begin to experience simple texts, using word banks and picture prompts to support understanding.
Outdoor Education	 In outdoor learning we will take part in the RSPB Big Schools Bird Watch. Our outdoor learning will link to our learning about water and cloud formation. We will learn about map work and orienteering.
