Literacy	Reading Our class novel this term is 'Pugs of the Frozen North' by Philip Reeve and Sarah McIntyre. It showcases excellent examples of figurative/ descriptive language.	 We are developing our skills in reading aloud, working on understanding, fluency and expression. We are learning to identify the purpose and main idea of a text. We are learning to identify different genres. We are developing skills and strategies to help us read and understand texts. In particular we will be learning to make predictions, summarise the plot, discuss characters and setting, and make links to our own experience and other texts. We are developing our dictionary skills.
	Writing	 We are learning to write narrative texts. We are continuing to develop our spelling at our own level and to apply it to all areas of literacy. We will continue to develop our tools for writing through QI: this term we will be focusing on the use of interesting openers. Some pupils will also develop their use of figurative language. We are learning to form letters correctly, join and present our work neatly in handwriting. In Grammar we are developing our understanding of punctuation, the Parts of Speech and alphabetical order. We are learning to check our work and give feedback that is useful, specific and kind.
	Listening & Talking	 We are learning about group discussion. We will be developing our skills in listening to others and asking questions to help them develop their ideas. We are learning to identify the purpose and main idea of texts we listen to and watch.

Numeracy	 We are learning to round numbers to the nearest 10/100/1000, and to use rounding to help us estimate the answers of addition and subtraction problems. We are developing our knowledge of place value, working with 4-digit numbers to name and order them, understanding the role of 0 as a placeholder. Some pupils will also work with 5- and 6-digit numbers. We are learning to add and subtract 1s/10s/100s from numbers. We are learning to use a variety of mental and written addition and subtraction strategies. We are learning to recognise and continue number patterns and sequences. We are learning about the properties of 2D shapes and 3D objects.
Social Studies Topic: Extreme Earth- Natural Disasters	 We are learning about the causes of different natural disasters, and about their effects on the human and physical landscape. We will consider how landscapes affect land use, and compare Kingsbarns with other places where processes like flooding and earthquakes are regular occurrences. We will consider how human influence on the climate can contribute to the occurrence of some natural disasters.
Health & Wellbeing, including PE	 We are learning to pass and shoot accurately, work well in a team and communicate with others through the sports of basketball, netball and football. We are developing our fitness and stamina in running. We are learning about factors that can affect our feelings and emotions. We are learning to discuss feelings, emotions and things that help us deal with different emotions. Through Assemblies, we will continue to develop our understanding of resilience.
Expressive Arts	 Art/ Technologies We are exploring the visual elements, with a particular focus on form and 3D structure creation. Music We are fortunate to have been offered a place on the 'Wee Big Sing' from the Fife Youth Music Initiative. The project will conclude in February when we will attend a music workshop with other schools and then take part in a performance of singing.

Digital Literacy	 We are learning to use technology to type and find information, and to save different file formats. We are learning about responsible digital behaviour.
RME	 We are exploring creation stories from different religions. We are learning about rites of passage (e.g. births, coming of age, weddings) in the context of Hinduism, Buddhism and Sikhism.
Languages	 We are developing our knowledge of French vocabulary for greetings, numbers, months and days of the week.
Outdoor Education	Our outdoor learning will link to our learning about natural disasters. We will also use it to support the development of teamwork skills.
Metaskills	We will be working particularly on social intelligence, with a focus on collaboration. This will involve some work with P1-3 too.
