Literacy	Reading  Our class novel this term is 'Pugs of the Frozen North' by Philip Reeve and Sarah McIntyre. It showcases excellent examples of figurative/ descriptive language.	<ul> <li>We are continuing to develop our skills in reading aloud, developing our understanding, confidence, fluency and expression, and experimenting with pace and tone.</li> <li>We are learning to identify the purpose and main idea of a text.</li> <li>We are learning to identify characteristics of different genres.</li> <li>We are developing skills and strategies to help us read and understand texts. In particular, we will be learning to summarise and sequence the plot, discuss character and setting, make links to our own experience, other texts, authors and perspectives, and to make appropriate predictions, explaining the reasoning for our ideas.</li> <li>We are developing our dictionary skills to support our ongoing spelling work and use of vocabulary.</li> </ul>
	Writing	<ul> <li>We are learning to write narrative texts.</li> <li>We are continuing to develop our spelling at our own level and to apply it to all areas of literacy.</li> <li>We will continue to develop our tools for writing through QI methodology: this term we will be focusing on the use of figurative language and interesting openers.</li> <li>We are learning to form letters correctly, join and present our work neatly in handwriting.</li> <li>In Grammar we are developing our understanding of a variety of punctuation marks and of the Parts of Speech.</li> <li>We are learning to check our work and give useful, specific feedback to help us develop our work.</li> <li>We are developing our ability to summarise and paraphrase texts.</li> </ul>

Listening & Talking	<ul> <li>We are learning about group discussion. We will be learning to build on the contributions of others by clarifying or paraphrasing points and by asking and answering relevant questions.</li> <li>We are learning to identify the purpose and main idea of texts we listen to and watch, and to give supporting detail.</li> </ul>
Numeracy	<ul> <li>We are learning to round whole numbers to any graduation, and to round decimal fractions to at least 2 decimal places.</li> <li>We are learning to use rounding to help us estimate the answers of problems.</li> <li>We are further developing our knowledge of place value, working with integers and decimal fractions to name and sequence confidently.</li> <li>We are learning to increment/ decrement with a large range of numbers.</li> <li>We are learning to use a variety of mental and written addition and subtraction strategies.</li> <li>We are learning to recognise, describe and continue number patterns and sequences.</li> <li>Some pupils will describe sequence rules in algebraic notation.</li> <li>We are learning about the properties of 2D shapes and 3D objects; investigating the nets of 3D objects, using the terms radius, diameter and circumference to talk about circles and using our knowledge of radius and diameter to draw circles.</li> <li>Some pupils will learn to accurately draw 2D shapes, including triangles, using mathematical instruments, when given an interior angle.</li> </ul>
Social Studies  Topic: Extreme Earth- Natural Disasters	<ul> <li>We are learning to describe the physical processes of a natural disaster, and to discuss its impact on people and the landscape.</li> <li>We will consider how landscapes affect land use, and compare Kingsbarns with other places where processes like flooding and earthquakes are regular occurrences.</li> <li>We will consider how human influence on the climate can contribute to the occurrence of some natural disasters.</li> </ul>
Health & Wellbeing, including PE	<ul> <li>We are learning to pass and shoot accurately, work well in a team and communicate with others through the sports of netball, basketball and football.</li> <li>We are developing our fitness and stamina in running.</li> <li>We are learning about factors that can affect our feelings and emotions, and strategies to support ourselves and our friends.</li> <li>Through Assemblies, we will continue to develop our</li> </ul>

	understanding of resilience.
Expressive Arts	<ul> <li>Art/ Technologies</li> <li>We are exploring the visual elements, with a particular focus on form and 3D structure creation.</li> <li>Music</li> <li>We are fortunate to have been offered a place on the 'Wee Big Sing' from the Fife Youth Music Initiative. The project will conclude in February when we will attend a music workshop with other schools and then take part in a performance of singing.</li> </ul>
Digital Literacy/technology	<ul> <li>We are learning to use technology to type and find information, and to save different file formats.</li> <li>We are developing our knowledge of formatting texts in Word, e.g. line spacing and columns.</li> <li>We are learning about responsible digital behaviour.</li> </ul>
RME	<ul> <li>We are exploring creation stories from different religions.</li> <li>We are learning about rites of passage (e.g. birth, coming of age, weddings) in the context of Hinduism, Buddhism and Sikhism.</li> </ul>
Languages	We are further developing our knowledge of French vocabulary for greetings, numbers, months & days of the week.
Outdoor Education	Our outdoor learning will link to our learning about natural disasters. We will also use it to support the development of teamwork skills.
Metaskills	<ul> <li>We will be working particularly on social intelligence, with a focus on collaboration. This will involve some work with P1-3 too.</li> </ul>
