Literacy	Reading  Our class novel this term is 'Odd and the Frost Giants'. This will link with our topic learning about the Vikings.	<ul> <li>We are continuing to develop our skills in reading aloud, focusing on using punctuation clues and our understanding of dialogue to promote fluency and expression.</li> <li>We are learning to discuss our preferred texts, commenting on the author's choice of language and with relation to genre, text type and author.</li> <li>We are developing skills and strategies to help us read and understand texts. In particular we will be learning to discuss themes and point of view, to identify the writer's style and to discuss the structure of a given a text.</li> <li>We are developing our skills in finding words in the thesaurus and using this to support our vocabulary.</li> </ul>
	Writing	<ul> <li>We are learning to write recount texts, focusing on summarising a sequence of events and sharing our thoughts and feelings, giving a personal comment.</li> <li>We are continuing to develop our spelling at our own level and apply it to all areas of literacy.</li> <li>We will continue to develop our tools for writing through QI: this term we will be focusing on the use of figurative language and on interesting vocabulary.</li> <li>We are learning to form letters correctly, join and present our work neatly in handwriting.</li> <li>In Grammar we are developing our understanding of synonyms and antonyms, apostrophes (for possession and contractions), speech marks, syllabification, colloquialisms, idioms and paragraphing.</li> <li>We are learning to use a thesaurus to support the use of a varied vocabulary.</li> <li>We are continuing to learn to check our work and to give and receive feedback.</li> </ul>

Listening & Talking	<ul> <li>We are learning to discuss our preferences and give a detailed personal response to a text, including some analysis.</li> <li>We are developing our presentation skills through the use of 'pecha kucha' presentations, discussing eye contact, body language and pace, use of language and vocabulary, gesture and emphasis, choice of words and tone.</li> </ul>
Numeracy	<ul> <li>We are continuing to develop our use of addition and subtraction- mental and written.</li> <li>We are developing our use of mental and written multiplication and division methods, including with decimal numbers.</li> <li>We are learning to recognise multiples and factors, and to use our knowledge of them to solve problems.</li> <li>We are learning independently collect, organise, display and interpret information using a range of graphs, tables and pie charts and making effective use of technologies.</li> <li>We are learning to analyse and draw conclusions from data.</li> <li>We are learning to use digital technologies to create spreadsheets and line graphs.</li> </ul>

Health & Wellbeing, including PE	<ul> <li>We are exploring movement and expressing our ideas through creative dance.</li> <li>We will be developing our control, fitness and team work through the sports of rugby and hockey, learning to follow rules in a game and use tactics and spacing.</li> <li>We are learning to give and act on feedback.</li> <li>We are learning to assess and manage risk (fire safety, frozen water safety)</li> <li>Through our Pupil Leadership Groups, we are learning to contribute to our community, bringing about</li> </ul>

Expressive Arts	<ul> <li>Drama</li> <li>We are exploring movement, expression and voice.</li> <li>We are experiencing performing for an audience through taking part in our Christmas show.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Art</li> <li>We are learning to use a range of media, including collage and digital technologies to create artwork.</li> <li>We are learning about perspectives and viewpoints.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>We are fortunate to have been offered a place on the 'Wee Big Sing' from the Fife Youth Music Initiative.         The project will conclude in February when we will attend a music workshop with other schools and then take part in a performance of singing. We are developing our use of pitch, melody, rhythm and dynamics through our singing both in this project and also in school as we prepare for our Christmas show.</li> <li>We are learning to respond to music through listening to and discussing some music of the Viking era.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Dance</li> <li>We are exploring movement and expressing our ideas through creative dance.</li> </ul>
Digital Literacy/technology	<ul> <li>We are learning to use technology to create graphs (Microsoft Excel)</li> <li>We are developing our use of PowerPoint and Canva.</li> </ul>
RME	<ul> <li>We are learning about rites of passage (e.g. birth, coming of age, weddings) in the context of Hinduism, Buddhism and Sikhism.</li> <li>We are learning about Buddhism.</li> <li>We are learning about the celebration of Christmas and how and why it is celebrated by Christians.</li> </ul>
Languages	<ul> <li>We are developing our knowledge of French vocabulary for dates, age, weather, classroom items, school subjects and Christmas.</li> <li>We are developing our skills in reading and writing French vocabulary and using a bilingual dictionary.</li> </ul>
Metaskills	We will be working particularly on the Metaskills linked to self-management: focus, integrity, adapting and initiative. This will involve some work with P1-3 too.
