Literacy	<p>Reading</p> <p><i>Our class novel currently is 'Pirates of Darksea' by Catherine Doyle.</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are continuing to develop our skills in reading aloud with expression and understanding, using context clues, punctuation and grammar to help. • Some pupils will continue to develop strategies to decode tricky words. • We will use our skills relating to factual texts and note taking as we research our personal projects. • We will continue to read for pleasure through 'drop and read'. • We are learning to recognise ways in which a text may try to persuade us.
	Writing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning to write information reports and discussion texts. • We are continuing to develop our spelling at our own level and applying knowledge of spelling rules to all areas of literacy. • We are learning to form letters correctly, join and present our work neatly in handwriting. • In Grammar we are learning about plurals, prepositions, prefixes and suffixes, as well as revising other punctuation learning from the year. • We will be using our note taking skills as part of our personal projects.
	Listening & Talking	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning to create factual texts through researching and presenting our personal projects. • We are continuing to develop our use of features of spoken language (pace, body language) and learning to communicate clearly and audibly. • We are learning to select and use an appropriate resource to enhance our communication. • We will also use our listening and talking skills in a class mock election campaign linked to our topic learning on Democracy.

<p>Numeracy</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are revising our knowledge of the 4 operations. • We are learning to use the written algorithm for addition and subtraction. • We are learning to use different combinations of coins and notes to make the same amounts of money. • We are learning to convert between pounds and pence and vice-versa. • We are learning to calculate cost and change. • We are learning to estimate and measure distance, volume, area and mass. • We are learning to make simple conversions between units of measure. • We are learning about equations: using the symbols for equal, not equal to, less than and greater than. • We are learning to find the value of pictures or symbols replacing numbers in a number statement. • We are learning about chance and uncertainty; using vocabulary to describe the likelihood of events occurring, and identifying situations where there is an element of luck. <p>In addition, those pupils working at Second Initial Engaging Level will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn to compare costs and budgets. • Learn about the benefits and risks of using bank cards to purchase items. • Learn to convert between units of measure. • Learn to solve problems where an unknown value is represented by a symbol or letter. • Learn about chance; conducting simple experiments and using the vocabulary of probability to describe how likely something is to happen.
<p>Health & Wellbeing, including PE</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are developing our fitness, stamina, strength and control through athletics. • We are developing our striking/ fielding skills through rounders. • We are developing our control, coordination and fitness through swimming lessons at St Leonards. • We will be carrying out our RSHP learning for the year- more information about what this involves for different year groups will be sent separately and is available on the RSHP website. • We are learning about positive relationships, peer support and peer pressure. • We are learning about rights and responsibilities. • We are learning to be safe around open water and in the sun. • Through Assemblies we are learning about Resilience. • We will have opportunities to contribute in our

<p>Science</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning to choose appropriate materials to solve practical challenges. • We are learning to make and test predictions about solids dissolving in water.
<p>Social</p> <p>Our topic for the term covers Democracy and how decisions are made in our country.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are about key features of democracy and parliament. • We are learning about elections. • We are learning about rules, rights and responsibilities. • We are learning about decision making.
<p>Expressive Arts</p>	<p>Music</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are experiencing the joy of performance through preparing for our end of term Assembly. • We are developing our skills in playing musical instruments and reading written music, considering rhythm, pitch and dynamics. • We are learning to express our ideas through music. • We are learning to respond to music: The Beatles: protest songs. <p>Art</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are developing our skills in using the visual elements. • Through Metaskills challenges, we are learning to solve design problems. <p>Drama</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning to use expression, movement and voice in drama activities. • We are learning to respond and give constructive comment on drama work.
<p>RME</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning about Christian stories from the Bible, through Bible Alive. Some volunteers from Scripture Union will come into our class to deliver this interactive programme designed for schools. • We will consider what these stories show us about what Christians believe and how they put these beliefs into action.
<p>Digital Literacy/technology</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are learning to create digital animations with sound. • We are learning to name hardware components. • We are using a variety of digital resources to support our learning across the curriculum. • We are learning to design and construct models, sketch design ideas and evaluate and adapt our designs.

Languages	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• We are learning vocabulary for shopping, eating and preferences.• We will continue to experience simple texts, using word banks and picture prompts to support understanding.• We will learn some Spanish vocabulary (greetings, introductions).
Outdoor Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Through their hill walk day and the preparation for it, pupils will learn about map reading and mountain safety.• In our gardening learning, we will be learning to prick out and pot on seedlings. We will continue to learn about what plants need to grow, and will contribute to our school and community by investing in our school planters and community garden.
