I can make the text interesting by using a wide variety of adjectives. | Create a three- dimensional shape poem about an object using an object at home. • Find an interesting object and think of as many descriptive words and phrases to describe it as possible. • Remember to use your senses to give you ideas about e.g., what the object looks like, smells like, feels like • Now think about how you could attach your ideas to the object. e.g. • If you write about a cereal box, you could turn the box inside out and write on it. • If you write about a toy, you could write your ideas on post-its and stick them on. • If you write about your Dad's socks, you could write the ideas on paper and ask someone to help you pin them on. | You can upload a photograph and/or bring in your poem. |

I can share my research with others. | Research about how Christmas is celebrated in another country. You can e.g. find out about how people say, "Happy Christmas," special foods which are eaten, activities which people do, decorations which are made/used | You can now share what you have found out with others by e.g. writing or drawing before you bring in, email or upload your work. Upper school pupils could share their information as a SWAY, recorded video, PowerPoint or any other way that would be appropriate. |

- Numeracy:

Blue-Recognise coins and notes. Make some amounts of money up to 20p.

Green - Recognise coins and notes. Read some prices less than £1 - Which coins could you use to pay for them? Red - Calculate the cost of 2 items. Think about which notes or coins you could use to pay for them. What would your change be from £1, £2, £5, etc?

Yellow- Calculate the cost of collections of items by using a calculator. Which coins and notes could you use to pay for them? What would your change be from £1, £2, £5, etc?
