Term 1 and 2: September - December 2024

The main focus/theme for learning this term will be:

Term 1: Food and Farming

Term 2: Forces

Literacy:

Reading

Early – start to blend initial sounds and read tricky words. Recognise common words in a text. Identify information books.

First Level - read increasing number of common words confidently. Identify key information from texts. Answering literal, inferential and evaluative questions.

Second Level - identifying the purpose and main ideas of texts, answering literal, inferential and evaluative questions. Identifying fact and opinion and deciding if sources are reliable.

All - using punctuation and grammar to read with fluency and expression.

Writing

Text Type: Descriptive texts (term 1) and information texts (term 2)

Tools For Writing:

Spelling/Phonics

Early – initial sounds s, a, t, i, p, n, ck, e, h, r, m, d, g, o, u, l, f, b and associated tricky words

First and Second Level - long vowel sounds /a/, /e/, /i/, /o/, /u/ and revision of high frequency words 1-100 and 101-200

<u>Handwriting</u>

Early - letter formation of lower and uppercase letters linked to initial sounds being taught.

First and Second Level - reinforce correct letter formation and sizes, introducing joins when ready - working towards a fluent and legible script

Grammar/Punctuation

First Level - consistently using sentences and capital letters with connectives such as and, but, because.

Second Level - varying sentence length, varying sentence openers and using a wider range of punctuation marks correctly -!,:; ""

Listening and Talking

Early - identify and generate rhymes. Participate in songs, rhymes and stories. Hear and say the different single sounds made by letters.

First Level - know when and how to listen, when to talk, when to ask questions and how to respond with respect. Exchange information, explanations and opinions. Clarify points by asking questions.

Second Level - Engage with others, respond appropriately and build on their thinking. Identify purpose, main ideas and supporting details. As I listen or watch I can make notes.

All - explore pace, gesture and emphasis to engage others.
