Learning Overview

Term 3: January- April 2024

Our topic/theme for learning this term will be:

Jan-Feb- Scotland and Burns
March- Houses and Homes

Literacy:

Reading

We will continue to progress through the Rising Stars reading scheme with books being sent home weekly.

We will continue to learn our weekly phonics sounds and tricky words.

In reading sessions, we will be looking for the children to discuss events in the story, answer questions and share their thoughts and feelings about a text.

During our Scotland topic we will read and discuss Scottish poems.

Writing

Genre: Non-Fiction including leaflets and posters.

This term we will look at the features of non-fiction texts through our topics. The children will be encouraged to make their own leaflets using pictures and labels. We will continue to work on writing a sentence using correct punctuation and spelling our common words correctly.

In handwriting, we will begin to work on writing on a line and think about the correct sizing of letters.

Listening and Talking

This term we will learn how to talk to an audience. We will practise our pace, volume and gesture before reciting a Scottish poem to the class or a small group. We will also practise our listening skills and explore how to be a good audience.

Through stories and songs, we will listen to Scottish words and have a go using them.

Other Curricular Areas:

<p>Social Subjects:</p>	<p>We will use books and stories to help us find out all about Scotland! We will look at famous landmarks, maps, food, tartan and traditional music. We will find out more about Robert Burns and enjoy learning some Scottish words. After the February break, we will explore houses and homes of the past and present. We will also look at the houses we hear about in fairytales, we'll enjoy using everyday materials to build and model these homes.</p>	
<p>Sciences:</p>	<p>In science, we will explore different materials and their properties, we will select materials for a purpose and share why we have chosen that material. In our houses and homes topic the children will be given a design challenge based around the 'Three Little Pigs'.</p>	
<p>Technologies:</p>	<p>Digital Literacy- This term we will work together to find information using a search engine. We will identify the browser icon on the IPAD. We will create a short animation using still images.</p>	<p>Computing Science- This term we will continue our learning of algorithms. We will create our own algorithms and find simple mistakes in a set of instructions.</p>
<p>Art and Design:</p>	<p>In art and design our learning focus will be forming 3D models and shapes. The children have opportunities to independently explore and create in the art area. Materials will be provided to allow the children to create their own 3D models and practise the skills they have been taught.</p>	



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Music:	This term we will begin to look at musical notation and tapping out a rhythm. We will listen to traditional and contemporary Scottish music and identify the instruments we hear.
Drama:	In drama, we will focus on presenting our improvised drama to an audience.
Dance:	Scottish Country Dance
Religious and Moral Education:	This term our RME will focus on 'New Beginnings' and the Easter story.
Modern Languages/1+2:	This term, we will continue listening to French songs and stories, we will consolidate our learning of French colours, numbers and greetings. We will introduce the French days of the week.
