




Lawhead Primary School – Homework Challenges

Literacy – Listening & Talking Scots Poetry	<p>LI: I am learning to perform to and engage an audience.</p> <p>SC: use of pace, gesture, emphasis, eye contact, body language and expression.</p>	<p>Class teachers will support pupils to select a Scottish poem of suitable length and difficulty. Pupils will receive a copy of their selected poem to take home and practice. Pupils will also be supported to practice and understand their poem in class.</p> <p>The Burns Society will be in school on 25th January to listen to finalists. Before this date class teachers will listen to pupils reciting poems and identify finalists for any pupil wishing to go forward to judging by the Burns Society.</p>	<p>If any pupil is nervous about performing to an audience they can record themselves and share a video/audio file or can perform to their class teacher only or to a smaller group.</p>
Maths	<p>LI: to know and order coins I can calculate simple totals</p> <p>SC: can recognise and sort coins. Can add two amounts together to make a total</p>	<p>Sort a pile of coins into 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p. What similarities and differences can you see? Are they all the same shape, colour and size? 		<p>Do some rubbings of coins to look at the different sizes, shapes and details</p>   <p>Make a money caterpillar. Draw around some coins, then add some feet, head and antenna. How long can you make it? What is the total worth of the caterpillar?</p> <p>Add two collections together to find a total. Use coins and count out both amounts, then put them into your piggy bank. Tip it out to find out how much you have altogether!</p> <p>Create a shop at home. You can choose any items you want. Price each item. Write a shopping list, calculate the total, and for an extra challenge work out what change you might get.</p>

HWB	<p>LI Create your own dance sequence</p> <p>SC include travel, turn, jump, gesture, pause and fall</p>	<p>Once we have worked on creating routines at school, you can have a go at creating your own short routine.</p>	<p>Once you have created your routine, you could record and post in Teams or demonstrate it to the class.</p>
