This term we aim to write more than one sentence independently, using capital letters in the correct places and correct punctuation.

We will continue to work on formation of our letters including correct sizing and writing on a line.

We will develop our personal writing skills by writing about journeys we have made.

We will develop our imaginative writing skills by creating adventure stories.

We will learn about acrostic poems and try to write one of our own.

Listening and Talking

This term we will work on listening carefully to spoken texts so we can answer questions on what we have heard.

We will practise sharing our ideas to an audience by reading our stories or poems to the class.

Suggestions To Support Learning At Home This Term:
