You may wish to use one of the templates or do your own to give you more flexibility. Then, draw your pictures carefully and add comic book features such as speech bubbles, thought bubbles and captions. Finally add colour and other finishing touches to perfect your frame. There is no limit to the length of your comic but it is expected that you will produce between 6 and 12 frames of a good quality.	Templates are available but are intended only as a guide.
