

Milk Fund for Term 1 - 2024-25

The milk fund is now open for the provision of school pupil milk during Term 1, 2024-25; the cost for Term 1 is £8.25. The fund will remain open over the Summer break and will close at midnight on Sunday 25 August. Please ensure that you make a payment within this timescale if you would like your child to have milk in Term 1. Pupils will start their milk provision on Wednesday 21 August for payments made by midnight on Sunday 18 August. Due to supplier order deadlines, for any payment made between Monday 19 and Sunday 25 August, pupils will start their milk provision on Monday 26 August. Please also note that some pupil milk accounts have a credit, and we therefore request that a balance payment (to reach £8.25 total) is made so that there are no overpayments. Finally, if you have a child who is joining our Primary 1 in August, the School Office will send IpayImpact registration information home, in the first few days of starting school, if they are currently not registered. Smartphone Survey Results

These are the topline results from the survey carried out by Parent Council. The full report includes more detail and will be available for anyone to read on our school website.

76% of children of respondents currently have no mobile phone of any kind. 14% have a dumbphone which only calls/texts or a smartphone with severely limited functionality. This means that 90% of Lawhead children of respondents do not have a fully functional smartphone. For children who do own a phone, the most common use of the phone was calling/texting with family/friends (67%). Only 13% of children are using their phones to access Glow.

82% of respondents were concerned about their children being exposed to inappropriate material through a smartphone. Bullying and recording without consent were also listed as fears.

60% of parents said they would be interested in workshops on the following topics: Child Development and Screens, Online Safety and Using Smartphones in a Positive Way. 64% said they would like the opportunity to make a voluntary pledge delaying smartphone ownership and 22% were unsure and wanted to find out more about this.

We received double the number of responses we normally receive for surveys and would like to thank everyone for their thoughtful input. Parent Council and School Leadership have been discussing these results and our possible next steps. These will most likely include workshops for parents, presenting our findings to other cluster schools, and exploring a non-binding, voluntary pledge that interested families can make together to encourage delaying smartphone ownership. These suggestions will be presented and discussed in detail at the first PC meeting of the next school year, to which everyone is welcome.
