

Milk Fund for Term 1 - 2024-25

The milk fund is now open for the provision of school pupil milk during Term 1, 2024-25; the cost for Term 1 is £8.25. The fund will remain open over the Summer break and will close at midnight on Sunday 25 August. Please ensure that you make a payment within this timescale if you would like your child to have milk in Term 1. Pupils will start their milk provision on Wednesday 21 August for payments made by midnight on Sunday 18 August. Due to supplier order deadlines, for any payment made between Monday 19 and Sunday 25 August, pupils will start their milk provision on Monday 26 August. Please also note that some pupil milk accounts have a credit, and we therefore request that a balance payment (to reach £8.25 total) is made so that there are no overpayments. Finally, if you have a child who is joining our Primary 1 in August, the School Office will send IpayImpact registration information home, in the first few days of starting school, if they are currently not registered.
