You can draw this, make it with play-dough or make it with various objects.</p>	<p>You can bring the picture or model into school during this first term. There will be the opportunity to share your ideas with others. We will make a display in school.</p> <p>You can also bring a picture, photograph or a model of your plan into school where there will be the opportunity to share your work with others during Term 1.</p>
	<p>Term 2 Talk to your parents, aunties, uncles, grandparents....to find out what their favourite childhood toys were. What were they made out of? Where did they play with them?</p>	<p>Write some brief notes together so that we can share what you have found out with others in class. Bringing in a photo may also be helpful. (Parents you can write the notes and we can then read them together in class.) Term 2</p>
