•	Jurriculum Areas and Subjects	Literacy - Phonics/Spelling: Our school website contains information on the phonics/spelling progression we follow at Lawhead. During term 3 we will be focusing on the following sounds/spelling patterns in class: This term we will be covering the sounds: Suffixes- Plurals: s/es, change y to ies, fe/ves, o/oes, Drop the e/ing, Irregular plurals. These will be inserted into your child's reading diary/in their reading folder. Practise writing and saying the words and look up the meanings of unfamiliar words in a dictionary. You may wish to write a sentence for each of your words to use them in context.

	Mental Maths: Our school website contains information on the mental maths progression we follow at Lawhead. Access the planner for P5 and practice the skills for term 3. Pupils who feel less confident may want to master the skills for earlier levels and those who want to challenge themselves can access the planners for the stage above. Interdisciplinary Learning	Create a poster with information about a rock type. Choose from sedimentary, igneous and metamorphic rocks and design a poster all about this rock type. Here are some ideas to think about for your poster: How is the rock formed? What are some examples of this type of rock? Where might you find this type of rock? Create a Powerpoint about a natural disaster of your choice. First research the concept of natural disaster and choose one to focus upon - eg. volcanoes, typhoons, hurricanes, earthquakes. Include a title slide and a total number of 5-7 slides. Include information about the physical processes of that disaster and the potential impacts.
