There are 12 full weeks in Term 3 (13 weeks minus half-term) and the suggested amount is £2 per week for a child attending nursery full-time, however there is no obligation to contribute to this and any amount you wish to make will be gratefully received.

Attendance and Punctuality:

Pupil attendance is closely monitored at Lawhead. The target is for all children to have at least 95% school attendance. We understand that there are many varying and understandable reasons why children need to be off school sometimes but we are keen to support families where regular school attendance and punctuality is a challenge.

The overall average attendance for Lawhead is currently 94.69% (based on data from 08.01.25).

In term 1 **1272 minutes** of learning was lost due to pupils being late to school. In term 2 **3262 minutes** of learning was lost due to pupils arriving late to school. This equates to over 15 days of school!

So far this term **75 late arrivals** to school have been recorded by office staff and we have only been back at school for 2 weeks.

What are we doing to address this?

In the next few weeks Mrs Bain will be writing to all parents/carers where a concern has been noted in relation to attendance, punctuality or both. This will be any pupil who has attendance below 90% or where there is regular late arrival. Any pupil with attendance of 90-95% has been placed our monitoring list and will be reviewed at the end of term where we hope to see an improvement.

You can log into the Parent Portal app to review your child's attendance record or an attendance report can be provided upon request.

If you are experiencing any difficulties getting your child to school please make contact with the school as we are here to help.



Smartphones and Children: Information Evening

Hosted by Lawhead Parent Council

In June 2024, our Parent Council carried out a parent survey on smartphones and children.

- * 82% of respondents were concerned about children being exposed to inappropriate material through a smartphone.
- * Parents worried about bullying and recording/filming without consent.
- * 60% of parents said they would be interested in workshops providing more information on the topic.
- * 64% said they would like the opportunity to make a voluntary pledge delaying smartphone ownership and 22% were unsure and wanted to find out more.

Since the start of this school session we have shared our findings with other schools in St Andrews, our MSP, our MP and the Rector of Madras College. The survey has already been discussed by the parent councils of Greyfriars and Canongate, Mr Rennie's office, Ms Chamberlain's office and Ms Gilruth, Education Secretary have all replied.

On **Monday, January 20, 2025** we would like to invite interested parents to share information and discuss this matter informally. We will present information on the advantages and disadvantages of this technology for children, alternatives to smartphones for children, and local and national developments

Apply for your child's place in primary one today

All parents/carers of any child eligible to start primary one in August 2025 should submit an enrolment application online at fife.gov.uk/applyforaschoolplace

This straightforward system allows parents/carers to use the step-by-step form from a smart phone, computer or tablet at any time of the day.

You will also be able to upload verification documents too.

These documents include:

- birth certificate of child
- o council tax notification letter
- evidence of current address
 e.g. gas or electric bill,
 driving licence or benefits letter.

Important information for parents and carers

Applying for an nursery place for 3 & 4 years old children in 2025/26

Was your child born between 1st March 2022 and 28th February 2023?

Do you want your child to attend a Fife Council Nursery between August 2025 and July 2026?

- If your child does not currently attend nursery (academic year 2024-25) or
- if your child has a 2-year-old placement or
- if you are looking to change your child's current placement type you must complete an application form online at www.fife.gov.uk/elcplaces between 6th – 31st January 2025.

You will be able to apply for a funded early learning and childcare place at your preferred private nursery, playgroup or childminder, if they are in partnership with Fife Council. Applications should be made directly to these individual establishments and services.
