Poetry and personal writing reflecting on time at Lawhead

Tools For Writing:

Making text engaging for a reader and selecting features of presentation/layout to suit the purpose.

Including a range of sentences with different structures, varied openers and lengths for effect.

Using more complex types of punctuation appropriately writing (e.g. colons, semi colons, parentheses, ellipsis).

Listening and Talking

Presenting to an audience-leavers assembly.

Discussing class novel by responding to a variety of different question types i.e. literal, inferential and evaluative.
