Tempest Photographer - Monday 12th May:

Safety Concern:

A concerned member of the public has been in touch with us this week regarding the pedestrian crossing on the Lade Braes side of the school. While driving this person has had to carry out two emergency stops in recent weeks because pupils have been running across the road before the green man indicates it is safe to cross. We will be talking to the pupils about crossing the road safely at assembly next week but if your child uses this crossing you may want to talk to them about how to cross safely and reinforce this important safety message.
