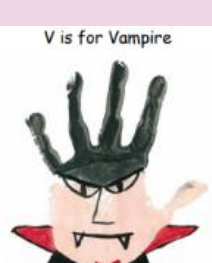
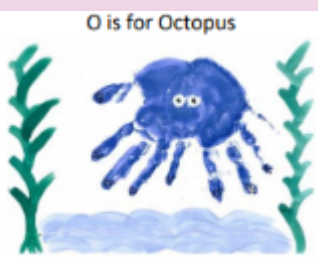

	BSL – Exploring Visual Communication – Hand Art: Create a handprint picture for every letter of the alphabet. You can try putting different colours on different parts of your hand to create different effects. You can also draw additional details to enhance your design. Curriculum Areas and Subjects	Literacy – Phonics/Spelling: Our school website contains information on the phonics/spelling progression we follow at Lawhead. During term 1 and 2 we will be focusing on the following sounds/spelling patterns in class: Spelling patterns and word lists will be sent home. Words can be copied/written at home (could be a good opportunity for developing handwriting skills too). Practising writing sentences that include the focus spelling words can consolidate both writing and spelling. Look out for the weekly patterns in group novel reading sessions at home. If Sumdog is accessible at home, spelling can be consolidated/developed within the spelling section.	Follow this link to the phonics/spelling section of the school website - Spelling Class teachers will send home phonics/word lists to practice. These will be sent home termly. Pupils may also photograph their weekly spelling patterns on their iPads to practice at home.

	Mental Maths: Our school website contains information on the mental maths progression we follow at Lawhead. Access the planner for P6 and practice the skills for term 1 and 2. Pupils who feel less confident may want to master the skills for earlier levels and those who want to challenge themselves can access the planners for the stage above. Interdisciplinary Learning	Literacy/Social Studies As part of our Social Studies this term, the class will be exploring social enterprise and careers. Your task is to gather information by interviewing an adult about their career/job. Questions could include: What is your job and what does it involve? Where do you work and who do you work with? What skills do you use? Did you have any training and if so, what did you have to learn? Do you have to wear special clothes or use special equipment? Did you have different jobs in the past? The person you interview could be a family member or family friend. Remember to get permission from an adult at home to speak/interview the person. Choose how you want to record the information from your interview, from the ideas that we discussed in class. (eg a video, a poster or report, a PowePoint, Book Creator, a short talk to the class, make a questionnaire for the adult to fill in, etc.) If you require support with this task, or any resources, please ask Mr Munro.	You can share your interview on Showbie in the homework section or bring something in to share with the class or the teacher.
	Art and Design/Music The class has been exploring the work of Scottish landscape artist Scott Naismith. As part of this focus, we are producing our own landscapes in his style. Your task is to pick an artist or musical performer/group, current or from the past, that interests you. 1. Find out: name, birth/death, nationality, type of work/music genre that they produce. 2. Create your own artwork or piece of music inspired/influenced by the artist. If it is a visual artist, it can be a painting, drawing, print, model/sculpture, photograph or design on Sketchbook (on your iPad). If it is a musician, it can be a song or a performance. If you require some support or inspiration, speak with Mr. Munro. We will share ideas as a class when we go through the homework grid together.	You can share your artwork or performance on Showbie in the homework section or bring something in to share with the class/the teacher or even perform your song/piece of music.

Opportunities For Personal Achievement	Celebrating Success – Weekly Assemblies: Every week at assembly we have a section called ‘Celebrating Success’. Success and achievements in and out of school are recognised and celebrated. We take photos of learners and add them to our achievement wall. If you have had a success or achievement outside of school please let Mrs. Simpson (P1-4) or Mrs. Bain (P5-7) know so that it can be included in the assembly.
