September Number Challenges:

Each month we will share a range of maths challenges and game ideas to support pupil learning within number, money and measure. These are just for fun for you and your child to try out at home. Have a look at the suggestions below:

- Find and record 20 numbers around your home or community.
- Estimate then count the number of steps from one room to another.
- Spot the largest and smallest number you can find on food packaging – encourage your child to read it out loud
- Salute: This three-player game needs one deck of cards. Two players each hold a card to their forehead without looking at it. The third player announces the sum or product of both cards, and each player must figure out their own card using the total and the card they can see. This game builds addition, subtraction and multiplication fluency while teaching logical reasoning.
- 101 and Out: Players take turns rolling two dice and deciding whether to use the digits as a two-digit number or add them separately – rolling 3 and 5 could become 35, 53, or 8. Keep a running total, but if you exceed 101, you're out. This game strengthens strategic addition and place value understanding.
