



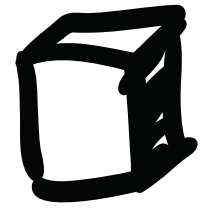
WORD WIZARDS.

Questioner.



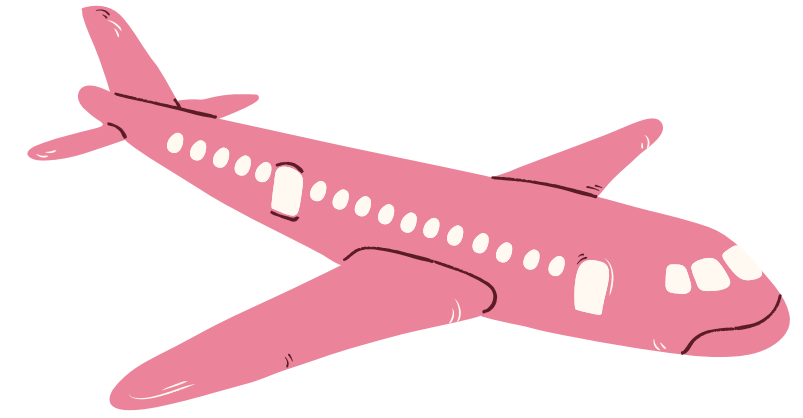
What you need to do: Develop a few questions relating to this part of the book.

Think about the main things that happened in your reading and the questions that may come from this?

Be prepared to share these with your group.



Travel agent.



What you need to do: Pay attention to where the setting is in your reading pages.

Have the characters moved location and for what purpose?

For example: Where the reading begins, where it ends, where key events happen.



Summariser.



Your job is to summarise the key plot moments from your reading pages. This can be a short paragraph about the key takeaway's (moments) that happened in your story.



Character Diary **DEAR DIARY**

Your job is to choose a character and write a diary entry from their point of view. Think about what is/has happened to them and consider how they might be feeling about it. As you share this with the group, they should feel like the character is sitting right there with them at their literature circles discussion.



Writer's Tricks



Your job is to collect a list of interesting and entertaining writer's tricks that you have read this week. The "tricks" could include ambitious adjectives or adverbs or examples of similes, metaphors, alliteration, personification or onomatopoeia. The list is endless!
