Funding

The Parent Council very kindly agreed to purchase every class in the school a visualiser. This was a significant expenditure of around £700. For anyone that doesn't know, a visualiser is a piece of equipment which you attach to your computer and it projects whatever you are doing onto the smartboard making it easier and clearer for everyone to see. They are used extensively across the school. I've been in a number of classes recently and have been pleased to see the new visualisers in use straight away.



Class Structures

As I mentioned in my last newsletter our numbers will be very tight again with no space at certain stages. This is a feature of the school and one we have had to deal with on many occasions over the last few years. Having looked at potential class structures it became clear that they can only be arranged in one way which I've outlined below:

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P.7a P.7b
P.6a P.6b
P.5a P.5b
P.4a P.4b
P.3a P.3b
P.2/3 P.2 P.1/2
P.1a P.1b
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There will be **15 classes** in total, the same as this year. As always classes will be arranged by age with the older pupils being in the 'a' class and younger in the 'b' class.

With regards to pupil numbers the following are the maximum numbers allowed in classes:

P.4-7 33 pupils**P.2-3** 30 pupils**P.1** 25 pupils

Any composite class 25 pupils

(The minimum number of pupils from one stage allowed is 4. I should point out that the numbers likely in our composites are fairly evenly split next session).

With regards to teachers this will not be confirmed until later in the term. However as soon as I know then I will let you know your son / daughter's class and their teacher. It looks likely that there will be a number of new teachers and if this is the case we will look towards ensuring they have the opportunity to visit the school and meet their class before the end of term.

I know that classes are always something which parents/children get anxious about and children being separated from their friends but I do everything possible to make the transition easier hence the reasons I am sharing this information with you just now. However, I ensure that I follow the guidelines so that I am fair to everyone and everyone is treated equally. When the classes are sorted I always have parents asking if their son/daughter can move class to be with their friends if they are separated. I'm afraid I can't do this as I have to follow guidance and treat everyone equally in the process.

One other thing worth mentioning regarding classes and staffing is that alongside Mrs Mohammed and myself we will have another Depute Headteacher (DHT) joining us. As the school has grown even bigger (likely to have around 430 pupils in August) we are now entitled to another DHT. How the classes are split between myself and the 2 DHTs will be shared when we have confirmation of the new DHT although there won't be any dramatic changes (hopefully).
