Indoor Nursery - Outdoor Learning

All of our children are enjoying spending extended amounts of time learning outdoors in our nursery garden. Nursery staff have spent time developing our outdoor areas to ensure a rich learning environment to meet all of our children's needs. Resources are available to provide learning experiences from all areas of the curriculum. Nursery staff support children's individual learning through quality interactions and support children to make choices about their learning, develop skills for life through play and to take risks in their play to develop skills to assess risk in a controlled environment.

As your child is encouraged to spend a large part of their nursery session in the outdoor area, can you please ensure your child is com-

ing to nursery prepared for all weathers!

This may include;

A waterproof suit, wellies, mucky trainers, warm hat and gloves.

Please can you check that your child's clothes, jackets, wellies and shoes are all clearly labelled with their name on. Thank you!

Winter Clothing

As we approach the winter months, here are some clothing tips to keep your child warm and dry while they enjoy the beautiful surroundings of Pittencrieff Park.

- Remember, all children will be provided with a fleece lined waterproof suit,
 often preferred by the children so they can look the same as their friends!
- Lots of layers! Essential for your child to keep warm, and to cool off after lots of physical play—vest, long sleeved t-shirt, jersey, socks, leggings, joggers
- A full change of clothes should be provided everyday, in a waterproof bag (a simple carrier bag is perfect!) incase of messy/muddy/wet play
- A warm hat and a pair of warm, waterproof gloves
- Wellies—these are also available for all children to borrow
- A couple of pairs of warm socks

Some Little Reminders!



- Spare clothes and nappies/pull ups for your child are appreciated as, in line with our COVID risk assessment, we are unable to provide these from nursery.
- If your child has had sickness or diarrhoea please keep them off for 48 hours after their last symptoms.
- Please can you regularly check your child's hair for headlice.
- In line with the Scottish Government guidelines, if your child has any of these COVID-19 symptoms, please do not send them to nursery and contact NHS;
- A new, continuous cough
- High temperature
- Loss of or change in taste or smell
