#### Staffing Updates.

There have been some changes to staffing over the summer. We would like to welcome Ms Tannock and Ms Baxter who will be the team in P2/3, Ms Hay who, alongside Ms Wilson will be leading P5. Miss Miller and Mrs Nicolson will be supporting our learners within our ASC and we welcome Miss Lees back too. Our youngest pupils will also be greeting "new" staff, we would love to welcome back Miss. Carson to the nursery team. You are all very welcome!!!! As a 'cluster' we are in the fortunate position of having a Principal Teacher working with us. Laura Murdoch will be based at Rimbleton on a Tuesday and will be working collaboratively with the Primary 7 staff to help Raise Attainment in Numeracy, with the aim of linking with our local high school to ensure our young people feel prepared and ready for their next steps in education, we are all very excited and supportive of this work.

### <u>Health</u>

Public Health Scotland and the Scotlish Government want to take the opportunity to reiterate the core public health messages for schools in Scotland:

• Washing hands thoroughly using soap and water will help prevent the spread of common infections such as colds, flu, COVID-19, threadworms and stomach bugs. Hands should be washed throughout the day, e.g. before and after eating; after using the toilet; after coughing or sneezing; and when returning from breaks. Children need to understand why it is important to wash their hands; be taught how to wash, rinse and dry their hands correctly; and have easy access to running water and soap.

• Staff and pupils should continue to follow the advice set out on the NHS Inform website if they have symptoms of a respiratory infection such as coronavirus, this is summarised below.

- 1. Adults including staff, volunteers and parents visiting early year's settings, should stay at home and avoid contact with other people if they have symptoms of a respiratory infection such as coronavirus and they: have a high temperature or do not feel well enough to go to work or carry out normal activities, they should do this until they no longer have a high temperature (if they had one) or until they feel better.
- 2. Children who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can go back to school, college or childcare, and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature and they're well enough to attend.

As the children are beginning to mix there has been an increase in the reporting of Headlice and Threadworm to school. Both conditions are very treatable, treatment is readily available at the local Pharmacy. If you recognise any of the associated symptoms, listed on the NHS website please visit the Pharmacy and organise treatment for the whole family!!

#### Parent Partnership.

Please keep **Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> September** from 6-7.00 p.m free to come and meet the Parent Partnership and find out about how you can support our school. They are a great group of people that are very proactive in looking at ways to get families involved in improving our school. The P.P have provided the finances to facilitate 'treats' for the children as well as organise extracurricular activities. We always look forward to welcoming new members and hope to see more people come along. The meeting is only an hour and usually occurs just once a term, there is also no commitment to attend every meeting – I hope that I am selling this to you (3) - Please join us! We do need people to attend as there is a real possibility that the Parent Partnership will cease to exist.



## School Uniform

The children are asked to wear uniform. School uniform is a Navy/black jumper or cardigan and navy/black trousers or skirt (please no jeans.) If you would like to order a branded item of uniform the link below will take you directly to the website. On gym days the children are free to wear their gym kit to school. If you have difficulty with the cost of uniform, please let a member of the team know and we will do our best to help. We already have a huge amount of lost property in the container in the Junior shelter and on the lunch trolleys- can I please implore that you label your child's possessions as this makes reuniting item and owner so much easier!

#### <u>Car Park</u>

For health and safety reasons pupils are **not** allowed to access the car park space. If you are dropping your child off at school, please refrain from accessing the car park as this space is designated for staff and disabled access. Pupils should always enter the school grounds via one of the side gates or the pupil entrance closest to the Scotmid store unless an alternative has been agreed. Due to security this gate will be closed during the teaching sessions, only opening to allow pupils off premises at lunch.

#### Before and after school.

Breakfast club has now started again after the break. This is a provision that is run and funded for Rimbleton children by Rimbleton staff and school, my thanks go directly to Ms Todd and Ms Meldrum for their contribution. Breakfast club is available from 8:30 -8:50am where the children can choose between toast, cereal, and juice for a cost of **30p** a day. Some teachers have committed to facilitate an after-school club throughout this academic year- thanks to all that have volunteered– A diary of clubs will be issued soon.
