PAMIS rebound – Looking to start a rebound club at Viewforth. PAMIS are aware that all the equipment required is in place. We are still waiting on further information. JU met with KD to look at the School Sports award for Rosslyn. We have a Bronze Award already in recognition of our curriculum which is rich in physical activity. Next steps are to create an extracurricular club. You have been sent a FORMS questionnaire, and more details will follow. This will be a 3:15pm – 4pm session after school one evening. Parents will stay and play. Learners will vote each week on the activities they enjoy, and the club will be led by their votes. School Improvement and PEF



IDL - Personalised approach (interest-based learning)

Teachers have decided to launch IDL based on the needs of individuals/partners/small groups, taking account of the stages of play for each pupil.

Each learner will have their own project. We have agreed the planning format for this and will trial it with 1 learner per class this term. We have trialled a variety of options to arrive at an approach agreed by all teachers and relevant to individuals within each class.

We will share more on this as we approach our Learning Partnership in March.

Tracking update – The move to a Fife wide tool for tracking learners with complex needs is delayed. We were due to start this in January, but it is more likely that we will not be ready to pilot till Aug 2025. We will continue to use our current format for tracking till then.

Moderation update – We have been moderating our planning, tracking and reporting in school with teachers. We have agreed our expectation and standards in line with the National standard. We are now looking to moderate the SQA with our partner special schools to ensure we have a collaborative approach to moderation within the SQA.

SQA Pathway – short life working group. We have created SQA Pathways into destinations for adult life. We would like to share this with you and get feedback from families. Are the pathways helpful in selecting courses? How do we work back from possible destinations? How do we select courses in S4 in a timely way, having opportunities for taster sessions through S1-3?

10am Friday 7th March – You do not need to have a young person in S1-6 to join this. All are welcome!

Hairdresser update – Sharon continues to support learners within school and visiting a salon in the community. 2 of our pupils are ready to transition to a Kirkcaldy salon with their parents! This is life changing! But it is not just about a haircut. This opportunity allows an IDL approach to manging a difficult situation. We will continue to need your support in securing funding for next year as our PEF money has supported this for 5 years. Any ideas, please get in touch. We would love anyone to come and see the benefits of this in school.

Mini -bus driver update: 2 PSA staff are ready to sit their D1 and we are hopeful to have them MiDAS trained by the end of the school year. We also have a new minibus on order and expect delivery of this in the summer term.
