### School Improvement Plan




Each year as part of our schools self evaluation we identify a few priorities to develop and focus on, this school session 2021/2022 the school improvement priorities will be:

New Covid Guidelines



Due to a change in Covid guidelines for schools, from Monday 4th October our nursery and school pupils will be returning to a 9.00 am - 3.00 pm school day.

Pupils should line up in the following areas of our school:

Nursery - Parents can now drop off and pick up their nursery child at the nursery door. This is located in the bottom playground, if you are drop ping off your child later or picking them up early please use the buzzer next to this door.

P1/2 and P2/3 - Upper door at the back of the school (upper back playground)

P3/4 and P4/5 - Side entrance door at car park

P5/6 and P7 - Main door

Staff will be present to direct children to begin with so they are comfortable with where they are required to line up.

Teachers will bring in their class lines each morning from these areas. Parents are now allowed into the playground at drop off and pick up times however still cannot enter the school at present.

Pupil's will have one playtime each day from 10.40 - 10.55 am where they will be able to mix freely with other children from different classes.

We have been advised that lunch times should still remain staggered at this stage, as a reminder these are the following:

- P1/2 12.15 1.05
- P2/3 12.35 1.25
- P3/4 12.55 1.45
- P4/5 12.25 1.15
- P5/6 12.45 1.35
- P7 12.55 1.45

### Free school meals and Covid

A payment of £23.00 per child will be paid on Wednesday 6th October along with the £160 Scottish Child Payment - Bridging Payment.




The milk fund for term 2 (October - December 2021) will close on Wednesday 6th October. Please make payment by then via Ipay Impact to ensure your child receives milk.

**Parentsportal.scot** is a new digital service to help replace the traditional school bag run by providing direct communication to parents through a growing suite of online services.

#### What is Parentsportal.scot?

In support of Fife Council's ambition to continue improvement in parental engagement we have been working with national partners to develop a "Parents Portal".

The portal will be developed to provide parents with a clear insight to their child's education and to support transactional communications between parents and the school.

Registration for a Parents Portal customer account uses the **MyGovScot (My Account) service**. This is a secure and trusted service provided by the Scottish Government. Parents using IPay / IPayimpact will already have a My Account username and password.


#### This new service will introduce information about the school and will allow you to:

This is an exciting first phase of a new initiative which enables and creates a digital relationship between parents, pupils and schools.



#### Child / Toys ~ For Boys & Girls

Cars, trucks, etc, bala, complete psaws, action figures, colouring books, pens, crayons, lego blocks, yo-yo, bubble blowers, wooden and plastic toys, building blocks, pencil case, pencil sharpener, dominoes, play-doh / plasticine & cutters, fluffy toys, dots, schickers, writing pads, skipping cope, scart, mittens / gloves, hat, harmorica, games, cards

#### Teenagers ~ For young people up to 18 years age

Sportswear, scart, gloves, socks, hat, football memorabilia, writing materials, games, playing cards, bennis bat, tooth brush & paste, rol-on deodorants, comb, mirror, costume jewelleny, make-up, hair brush, toiletries, school stationery, clothing repair kits, sketch pad, coloured pensi/pencils.

#### Household Goods ~ For older folk & families

Scarves, gloves, hats, wrapped soap, toothpaste, toothbrush, disposable razors, shampoo, soap flakes, pan scourers, antiseptic cream, bandages, face or body creams, cosmetics, pens, writing pad & envelopes, T lights, candles, sewing kt.

Baby ~ Age up to 12 months This is given to new mothers and can include baby wipes, baby shampoo, baby of talc powder, bonnet, boutees and mits, baby grow, baby blanket, small soft toy or plastic rattle

What NOT to include in boxesigFood, sweets, chocolate & drinks, battery operated toys, conflict related items, matches, inflammable liquids, inflammable aerosols (e.g. deodorants & hair spray), seeds or any other living material, automatic washing machine powders For safety – Please securely sellotape tops of liquid containers.

Protect anything sharp and do not put anything sharp into the Toys box.
