Our P7 pupils have been demonstrating their athletic skills in running, javelin and speed bounce. All in preparation for our virtual athletics tournament. Good luck P7!

























Curriculum Rationale

Health



Our pupils received their flu vaccine in school on Friday 29th October. Only pupils whose parents gave permission for this were vaccinated. Our school had a high uptake this year which was great to see.

We would also like to remind parents that if your child is showing symptoms of Coronavirus such as a continuous cough, loss or change to taste or smell or high temperature they should book a PCR test (rather than take a lateral flow test) and wait for the results before attending school. This ensures we can keep everyone as safe as possible.

Pupil Voice Groups



Our **Pupil Council** group have been developing our garden. Each class now has an allocated allotment ready for planting and growing when the weather allows. This is part of our Eco development as we work towards our Green Flag. The Pupil Council group have also developed the garden area outside their classroom and have planted a variety of flowers. The group have also spoken with our Local Councillor Rosemary Liewald asking for plastic recycling bins for the school.

Our **Rights Respecting** group (P5/6) have been learning and sharing their knowledge about COP26 and the global goals for sustainable development. They have been learning about the 17 goals and writing letters to MP's raising their concern about damage to our environment.

Our **Sports Committee** are currently in the process of making videos for Wake Up Wednesdays, these videos will be shared with all the classes to encourage the children to participate in physical exercise. The Junior Playground Leaders are also making videos to send to each class to give them playground game ideas and now that the bubbles no longer exist they can work together in the

playground. They have also came up with Fruity Friday where if pupils bring in a piece of fruit for tuck on a Friday they get 50 points for their house.

Our **Mini Vinnies** group is our charity group and during advent we think about and collect food for those less fortunate than ourselves. From next week we will be looking for any donations of food that we can give to Cardenden Community Fridge. The Community Fridge is open for collections on a Friday between 2.00 - 4.00 and 6.00 and 7.00 pm or on a Monday between 1.00 and 3.00 pm.


