Literacy	
Reading	<p>-Comparing and talking about the structure and features of a range of non-fiction texts. -Making and organising notes showing understanding of the text. -Responding to a range of questions to show understanding of the text.</p>
Writing	<p>-Developing spelling and spelling strategies. -Non-fiction – writing reports, fact files, newspaper articles with the focus of connectives.</p>
Listening & Talking	<p>- Asking and creating different questions with increasing detail. -Using question stems to create questions.</p>
Modern Languages	<p>French: Consolidating and developing our vocabulary about ourselves and our family.</p>

Number, money & measure	<p>Multiplication and Division: --multiplying and dividing decimals. -using long multiplication techniques. -dividing with remainders.</p>
Shape, position & movement	<p>Coordinates: -understand the elements of the coordinate grid and that there are four distinct quadrants in the coordinate plane. -identify and plot the coordinates of a point in any of the four quadrants. Symmetry</p>

Physical Education	<p>This term we will be focusing on football skills.</p> <p>Our gym days this term are: <u>Tuesday</u> and <u>Wednesday</u> Please come to school wearing plain gym kit – black or grey tracksuit bottoms or shorts, a plain white t-shirt and school jumper.</p>
