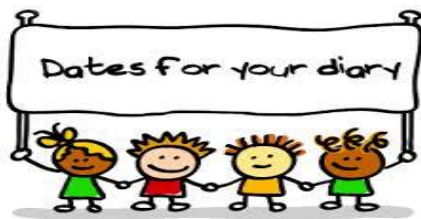
Keeping Connected
