


Support for Learning

We will be able to show how our MAD group work can make a difference to our school and Tayport community.


We are a reading school and have planned visits to Tayport Community Library early this term.

Supporting learning at home:

It is the first term of Primary one and we recognise that your children will likely be tired after a busy day at school. We usually find that little bursts of practise often is much more beneficial than sitting down for long periods. Every child is different however, so do what works for you and your family. Any questions, please just ask!

Activities that would benefit your child this term:

Name Writing: Practise writing their name using the name cards provided. It is really important we develop correct formation from the beginning, so we do a lot of finger writing first in class (asking them to trace the letters with their finger, starting at the right point and going in the right direction). Once confident with this, they can use the pen to trace the letters and once confident tracing they can practise writing their name on paper, with chalk outside, with paint, with a stick in the mud.... The more practise the better and while it can be messy, children love and gain so much from different sensory experiences. If your child is very confident writing their first name, you could introduce writing their surname too.

Numicon kits: Explore the Numicon kit provided with your child and work through the suggested activities. Numicon is such a great tool that we use throughout the school and developing the children's confidence, recognising and working with the shapes at this stage will greatly support them moving forward.

Enjoy reading stories regularly. Take the time to ask questions about the characters and the plot. Maybe your child could ask you questions too? You could also have a go at retelling some stories, acting them out or using puppets or props.



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

Supporting learning at home:

Reading books will be issued on a Monday and need to be returned on a Friday morning. Phonics/spelling homework will be issued on a Monday and homework needs to be returned on a Friday.

Maths homework – A booklet will be issued at the beginning of the term and the children will have the term to complete it.

To give children extra practise with their learning they could also complete the following activities:

- Access Reading Eggs
- Practise Number Bonds on 'Hit the Button' website.
- Watch 'NumberBlocks' or 'AlphaBlocks' online.
- Encourage reading and listening to a range of stories and visit the library if possible.
- Talk about what being resilient means to your family. Why is it important?

P1-4 Literacy and Numeracy Group time



Our five P1-4 teachers work very closely to ensure there is pace and challenge in phonics and numeracy learning.

- This is achieved by using various assessments to find the best suited phonics and numeracy group.
 These groups are **fluid** meaning the teachers meet and feedback to each other regularly.
- Most weeks P1-4 children do four targeted phonics session and numeracy sessions.
- Their homework is aligned to this learning.

Promoting Independence

Our classroom learning environment is organised to promote calmness, organisation and independence. Here are some of the things in place:

- Pupil leadership children lead their learning through the play environment.
- Children are responsible for tidying the classroom and making sure that they look after all equipment.
- Children practise good listening skills during teaching sessions on the carpet. They contribute their ideas and listen to others.
- They help each other, practise turn taking and share during play.



You can promote and support this independence further at home by:

- Pre-order school lunches with your child so they know what they are having.
- Support your child to choose their own snack and put into their bag along with filling their own water bottle.
- Put their name on all clothes and water bottles – show your child where to find this!
- Ask them about their day using the learning overview to guide you with expectations.
- Encourage them to see the positive impact of doing a little homework over the week.

Homework expectations

Homework is issued at the start of the term.



- Reading books for Primary 2 children go home on a Monday and need to be returned by Friday.
- Homework for P2 includes phonics/spelling, Maths and reading.
- Homework for P1 includes name writing and their Numicon kit.


