

Whole School – My Brilliant Machine - Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)

This term P2 will be exploring the human body within the whole school theme of "My Brilliant Machine". The children will be exploring the human skeleton as well as looking at the 5 senses and common illnesses such as the common cold.

Some of our IDL will be delivered through the outdoor learning Natural Connections programme:

Foundation:

- **Explore and discover** The children will be going on a senses walk, identifying things they can see, hear, touch, smell and taste in the local area.
 - The children will explore the local area and create a model skeleton from natural resources.
 - The children will listen and look for different birds and create feeders.
- Adventure play
- **Helping hands –** The children will plant herbs that they will be able to smell.
- Walkabout

Curriculum Areas and Subjects:
