



The summary below focuses on changes (up or down) in feedback from families over the past year. September 2025's responses represented 19% of current families' opinions.

Almost all respondents (90-99%) - There continues to be a steady increase in families recognising that:

- the school encourages children to treat each other with respect.
- they are satisfied with the quality of teaching in the school.
- they are comfortable approaching the school with questions, suggestions or problems.
- overall they are satisfied with the school and would recommend the school to others.

Most respondents (75%-89%) said the school is well led and managed.

Feedback for us to act upon:

- 50% of respondents said they did not know if the school deals with bullying.
- Almost half of respondents said they did not know if the school takes their views into account when making changes.
- A minority said the school does not give advice on supporting learning at home.

During term one we revisited [#operation_kindness](#) for a second year. All classes have helped set "boundaries" for around the school :[Positive Relationships and Anti-bullying Policies | Tayport Primary School](#) . In term two our anti-bullying fortnight will build on this learning, revisiting our anti-bullying policy. the Digital Leaders will create a video to share anti-bullying messages with families .

We try to consult with families in many ways e.g. parent focus groups, surveys, parent council. We use the weekly school update to share the impact of this.
