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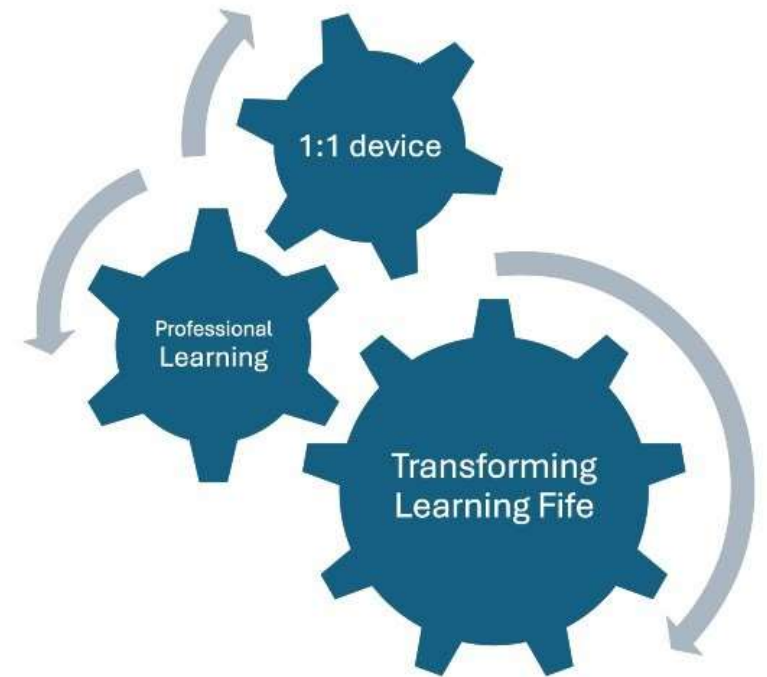


# Transforming Learning Fife

This is an investment in young people to develop their confidence as well as the digital skills they will need throughout their educational journey and beyond.



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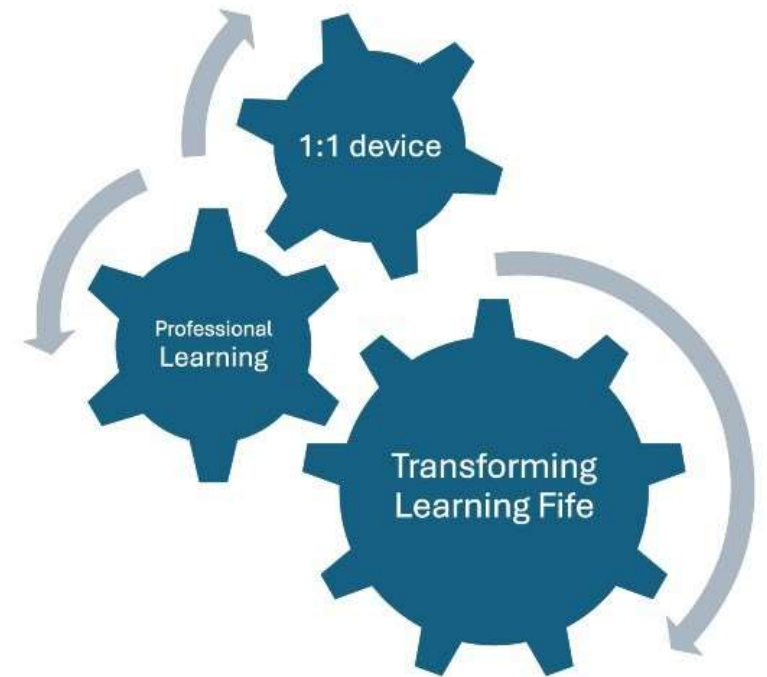


# Transforming Learning Fife

## The Vision

In 5 years time, teachers in Fife will have transformed learning by:

- integrating **digital skills** throughout the learning process to engage and motivate learners
- using technology for **effective explanations** and **modelling** to learners
- providing **personalised learning experiences** and facilitating learners to lead their own learning
- improving **assessment** and **feedback** with digital tools



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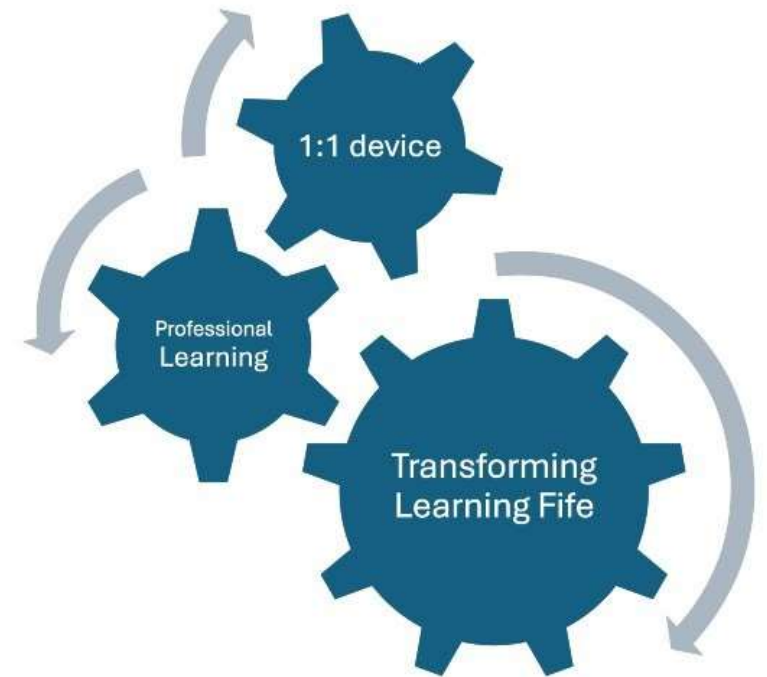
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# Transforming Learning Fife

## Early Data

- Increased pupil engagement and participation
- More consistent use of digital learning tools
- Improved access to resources and quicker feedback for pupils
- Significant reductions in printing in some schools



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# Transforming Learning Fife

## Early Data

### Pupil Voice

We only use iPads for educational purposes and teachers can control what we access.

We take pictures of the board, for example our spelling words, to make them easier to see before we write them down.

Apps like Freeform, Canva and Book Creator have made learning more enjoyable and fun.

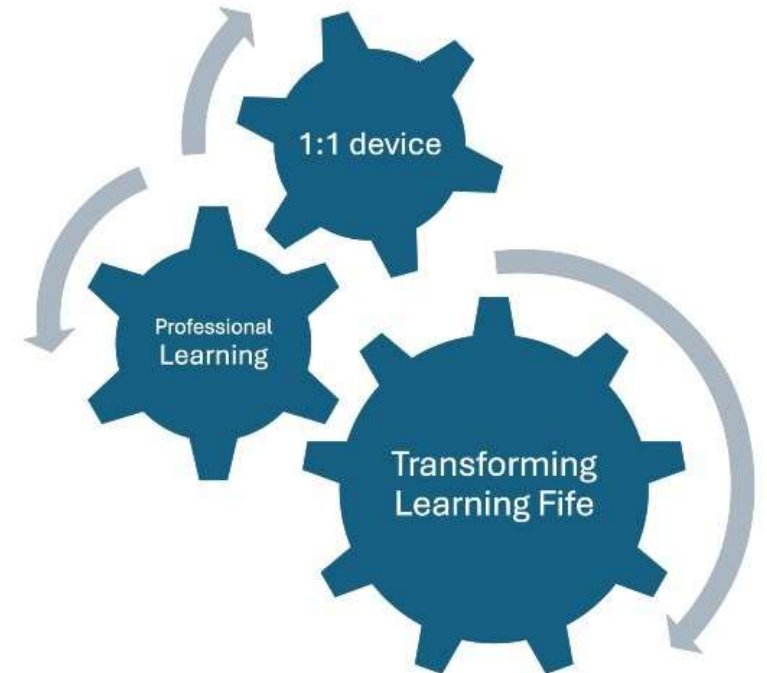
It is useful the work is sometimes on Showbie.

We use our iPads to see some of the work we have to do but we do our work in our jotters.



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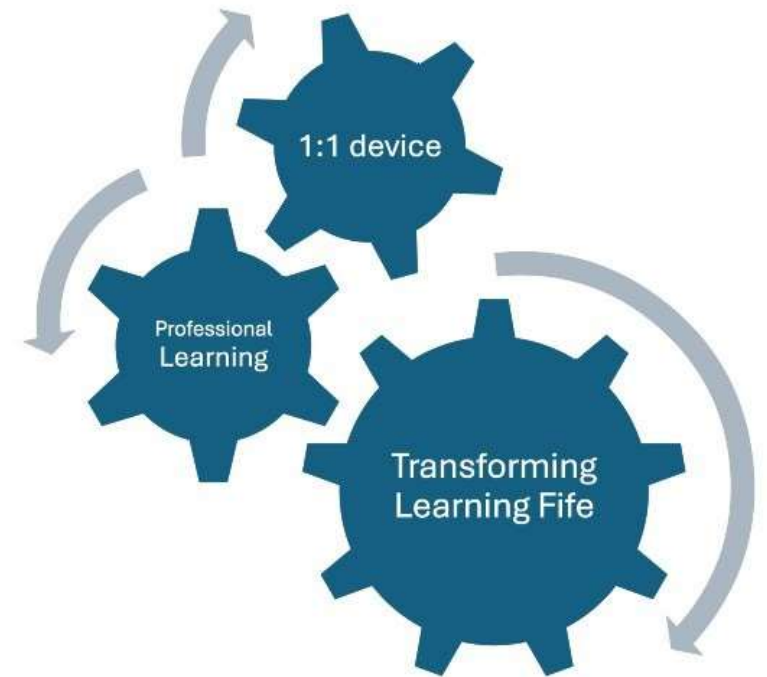

## Tayport Primary School iPad Agreement

Write your passwords down somewhere safe.

Make sure it is fully charged before coming to school.

Don't decorate the iPad or case – use the template.

Bring it to school everyday!

We are responsible for any damages.

Be gentle with it.

Use online features appropriately.


Stay calm when using the iPad.

Only use it for educational purposes.

Don't take it out in a public place.

Be careful with your school bag.

# Transforming Learning Fife



## Jamf Parent - setting iPad restrictions at home

Using the Jamf Parent app you can:

- allow and restrict apps to **choose which apps your child can use**
- enable App Lock to **set a timer for app restrictions**
- create locations to **see the approximate location of your child's device**
- create a Device Rule to **schedule app restrictions**

## Showbie - viewing your child's schoolwork at home

By creating a Showbie parent account you can:

- see your child's **assignments**, **feedback**, and **grades**
- receive **email** or **push notifications** about new assignments, deadlines, and feedback





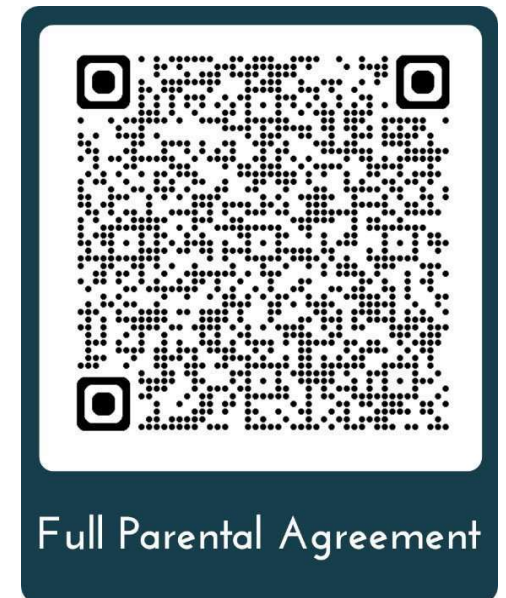
# Transforming Learning Fife

## Parental Agreement

Fife Council provides P6-S6 pupils with an iPad to support their learning in and out of school. By your child using this iPad, you, as a parent/carer, agree to the following terms:

### Responsibility for Parents

- You are responsible for the safe storage and use of the iPad at home
- The iPad should be stored securely when not in use
- If the iPad is lost, stolen, or damaged, report it to the school immediately
- Your child must bring their iPad to school fully charged every day
- No stickers or markings should be placed on the iPad or case
- If your child leaves Fife Council Education, the iPad must be returned to their school





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## Safeguarding and iPad use at home

The device will support young people's education and creativity – but it also comes with responsibilities around online safety and wellbeing.

### How you can support at home

- Talk regularly with your child about their online experiences – what they enjoy, what worries them, and who they interact with.
- Set boundaries for screen time and device use, especially around bedtime and social media.
- Encourage responsible behaviour- remind them what they post online can have lasting consequences.
- Know where to go for help – you can also use CEOP and Fearless to learn more about online risks and how to respond.

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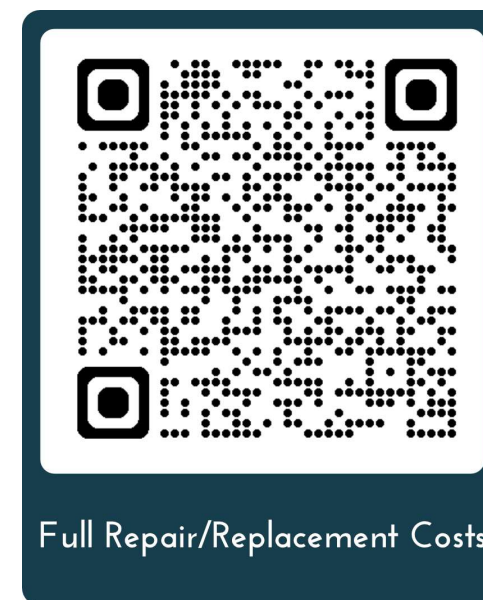
## Damage - Repair/Replacement Costs

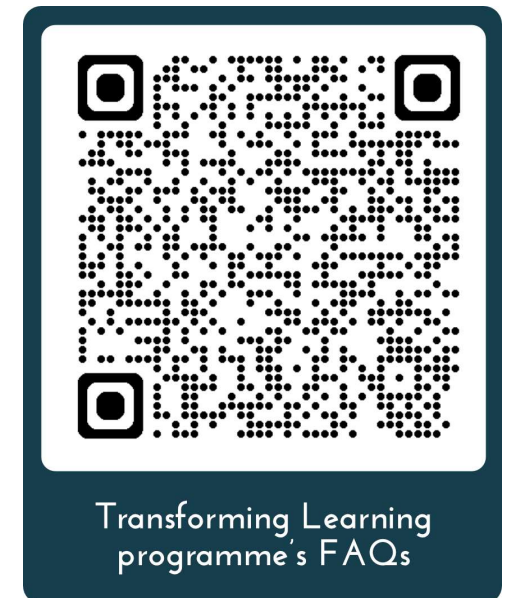
