- Have you prepared notes or cue cards so that you can present confidently?

# Top Tips:

- 1. Keep it simple and do a little at a time.
- 2. Don't wait until the last minute!
- 3. Think about how to keep your audience listening and engaged.
- 4. Your presentation should last around 2 minutes.
- 5. Remember to practise before and have cue cards to help you so you can make eye contact with your audience.
- 6. Avoid long paragraphs on slides or posters (you should share more information than is written on your slides/poster/display).
- 7. Remember to be creative, individual and have fun!
