Primary 1-3

In P1-3, the following content will be covered through oral work

Primary 4

In P4, the previous content will be revised and children will begin to read and write and be explicitly taught grammar points:

Topics	Grammar / Points to Note
Greetings	Silent letters, accents on letters
Alphabet	
Numbers, ages, birthdays	Numbers 1-39, J'ai
Pets	Noun gender, forming plurals
Colours	Agreement and position of adjectives

Primary 5

In P5, children will revise the previous content and cover the following through reading, writing, listening and talking:

Topics	Grammar / Points to Note
Family	Possessive adjectives (my, your, his/her)
Descriptions	Adjectives, verbs 'avoir' and 'être'
Countries	In + country
Nationalities	Adjectives, verb 'être'

Primary 6 – In 2024/25, P7 will also do this

In P6, children will revise the previous content and cover the following through reading, writing, listening and talking:

Topics	Grammar / Points to Note
Sports vocabulary	Je joue au & Je fais du/de la/de l' Je ne fais pas de Frequency
Leisure activities	J'aime + infinitive
Weekend activities	Irregular verbs (lire, sortir, aller)

Primary 7 First year this will be added in is 2025/26

In P7, children will revise the previous content and cover the following through reading, writing, listening and talking:

Classroom objects and instructions	Noun gender, imperative
School subjects and opinions	Noun gender, connectors
What you wear to school	Adjectives
