Understanding Classification P1-3 Parent/Carer Invite to Information Session

As a result of education service reform and a reduction in allocated staffing, next session our school will reduce from 16 to 15 classes. **Our present P1-3 classes will need to be reclassified for August 2024**. This means in August some children will move into a different class from the peers they were in class with this session. The senior leadership team will consult with teachers in arriving at the final decisions on new class formations.

Our numbers are such that there is no requirement to reclassify our present P4-6 classes. Therefore, next session these children will all move up a stage with their current class peers. Here is a table of P1-7 classes for 2024-25:

P6b	P7a	P7b	

Where reclassification is required, decisions about which class children are allocated to are primarily based on their language and numeracy groupings. Friendships are also considered and we ensure each child has someone in their new class that they are friendly with.

The need to reclassify some classes already arises every year for several reasons, including:

- Class size guidelines, set by the Scottish Government, change as children move up stages as follows:
 - Primary 1 classes have a maximum of 25 pupils

- Primary 2-3 classes have a maximum of 30 pupils
- Primary 4-7 classes have a maximum of 33 pupils
- All composite classes have a maximum of 25 pupils.
- The number of new entrants joining Broomhill Primary usually differs from the number of Primary 7 youngsters leaving.
