

# **Bug Shake Down**

### The Task

Identify what mini beasts live in different environments

# How?

- Find a bush, small tree or log to investigate
- Place a white sheet under the object
- 'Gently' shake the object for 5-10 seconds
- Check out what you have collected (Research what these animals are called, or what families they belong to)
- Allow the bugs to return to their natural environment (or gently tap the sheet over the bush)

## Considerations

- Be careful not to damage the objects?
- Allow time for the animals to migrate back to their natural environments?







## What will you need?

Something white at least A4 in size (Paper, whiteboard, pillowcase, sheet)

Somewhere to investigate

### **Organisation & Layout**

- Space everyone out in a safe area
- Feel free to work in small teams
- Set a time limit to return to base

### **Learning Objectives**

- Nature identifying plants and insects
- Recording data

## Safety Information

- The mini beasts are very small, and humans are incredibly big in comparison - be careful with the mini beasts
- Many bushes and trees are fragile, so act cautiously and gently
- Be aware that some plants could be potently dangerous or cause an irritation (consider the use of thick gloves for protection)

#### **Review & Assessment**

- What have you found? (Try and identify the type of bug you have noticed on the white sheet)
- How many mini beasts did you find?
- How many legs does each mini beasts have?
- Do certain mini beasts prefer different locations?
