
All three groups received individual awards for their companies and a Social Enterprise Award for the school.

Social Subjects and Eco News

The route taken by the coach included the inner city areas of the Gorbals and the Parkhead / Dalmarnock area, where the class visited the Commonwealth Games athlete village, the Sir Chris Hoy velodrome and Celtic Park, where the opening ceremony takes place. 






Lourdes Go4Set!




SCHOOL WEBSITE

Important updates

Jewellery Piercings

This is just a timely reminder for parents/guardians to advise that the summer break is the ideal time for pupils to have personal jewellery piercings. This break can allow any piercing wounds to heal which then allows the jewellery to be removed for activities such as physical education or play. This coincides with the current advice from the Physical Education Code of Practice -

'Personal effects (e.g. jewellery, body piercings, items of religious significance, watches, hair slides and belts constitute a hazard and may cause injury if worn whist participating in Physical Education and must be removed.'
