At the beginning of term there is so much administrative work to be completed. There will be teething problems as there always is with technology but please bear with us and we will try to get these sorted as soon as possible. There have been a lot of questions so I have put together a brief update of the current situation below.



We need as many parents set up on this as possible, we have sent it out across group call and the majority of P1s should have the printed letter. Those that don't have one as of yet will receive this next week. This is where annual data forms, consent forms etc. will take place to encourage a paperless environment. We ask that you sign up to this as soon as possible.



As all new children are just getting set up on SEEMIS this week, an overnight update needs to take place to receive usernames and passwords to allow you to get set up and signed in. All new children will receive their letters next week for this as some children are still only being put on to the system so this will not show on Parent Pay till Monday.



It is important that all parents download the Xpressions app to your phone as this is the key communication between the school and home.



Mrs McGloughlin, our DLOL (Digital Leader of Learning), has put together an update on the current situation with Seesaw. Hopefully this will answer many of the questions being asked. I have attached this in a separate sheet.

School Uniform

We really appreciate your support in sending your child to school in school uniform. Children are strongly encouraged to wear school uniform as it promotes a feeling of belonging to the school and pride in being a member of the school community. Our 'hoodies' are very popular and they are very smart too. We still have a number of orders that were placed before the summer break that have still to be collected.



Can I ask you to come to the office to collect this as I have to pay the supplier for this next week. Uniform can be ordered at any time during the year. Chloe in the office is looking to set up the uniform shop on Parent Pay so any further orders can be ordered and paid for online. I will let you know when this is available.

It has been a difficult few years for schools, with lockdowns, quarantining and self-isolating having had a massive impact on pupils' education across the country. With the effects that Covid-19 has had on children's education and mental health over the last 12 months it is more important than ever that children are in school in order to close any gaps that children may have developed as a result of the pandemic. I am aware that there are occasions

when children are too ill to come to school. If your child is absent from school, you MUST contact the **attendance line on 0141-287-0039** before 9am. They will then update this on the system and we are then able to see why your child is absent. However, I understand that there are occasions when you feel you need to discuss a sensitive issue with the school. In these circumstances, please contact the school direct.



"Fuel Zone' is the catering service provided in all Glasgow Primary and Secondary Schools. The service is provided by Cordia who are part of Glasgow City Council. All primary 1-5 children can enjoy a free lunch, while primaries 6-7 can receive a three course meal with a drink for £1.90. All pupils are entitled to free milk. PLEASE SELECT your child's meal through Parent Pay - refer to Anderston Primary Thinglink to find out how to do this.

Cordia also run the Breakfast Club from 8am until 8.45am. The cost of the breakfast is £2.00. Please refer to our handbook to find out how you can access forms to submit to Glasgow Council if you are entitled to additional support including free breakfast.

Playtime Snacks

Please provide your child with a healthy playtime snack to eat at interval time. Chewing gum, chewy sweets, fizzy juice and glass bottles are not allowed in school. Children are encouraged to drink $\underline{\text{plain water}}$ in class throughout the day, so please provide a labelled water bottle for this purpose. School water bottles can be purchased from the school office at a cost of £2.00. We would also request that children do not bring nut products into school to take account of pupils who have nut allergies.



Car Parks

We are now returning to normal with regards to entry/exit to the school. Can I remind you that children should NOT be brought into school through either the lower or upper car parks? Due to the school having a nurture training room as well as increase in staff, the car parks can be



extremely busy with cars coming in and out at all times during the day. Children should enter through the gate in Houldsworth Street.

Can I also remind you that no cars should park immediately outside the school on the double yellow lines? This is illegal and there are regular wardens in the area that will be doing spot checks. It is also very dangerous and could put our children's lives in danger. If you are dropping off your child by car, park in Port Street - you are allowed 10 minutes before a warden can give you a ticket. We have been in discussion with the council for a calming traffic system to be installed at Houldsworth Street

and we are hopeful this should go ahead this year.

School Shelter

Over the summer period, we had a school shelter installed at the infant end of the school. Unfortunately, the drain pipes have been damaged already. Children /youths have been in during the summer and have been climbing onto the roof. They used the drain pipe to climb up and this has now come away from the post. I will be in contact with the community police to see if they can support us in coming up with deterrents to stop this from happening.

However, I am sure you will agree that the shelter looks amazing and we are extremely pleased with it. This has allowed for our indoor play to be extended outdoors and even if it is raining, the children will be able to develop skills at this area. For Primary 1 and Primary 2's, we would ask that the children bring waterproofs, wellingtons and strong outdoor shoes that can be left in the school. They will be going outdoors every day, participating in a range of progressive and creative outdoor learning experiences linked to different areas of the curriculum.



I am sure you will be really keen to meet your child's new teacher and we are in the process of arranging dates when you will be able to come

into the school to meet the teacher, see the classroom and view some of the resources they will be using this year. We look forward to seeing you at this informal event. There will be a formal Parents' Evening in October after the holiday break. Individual appointments will be given out and you will be able to speak to the teacher on a one to one basis. We look forward to seeing you.



We are delighted to announce that our Childrens' Festival will once again take place in the School grounds on Saturday 10^{th} September from 11am to 2pm. We hope that you will come along and support us bringing with you lots of your friends and family. This is a great opportunity to meet other parents in the Community.
