Annette Street Primary School Standards and Quality Report for 2021~22

The summary report is provided for parents/careers and partners to outline our achievements this session and our priorities for next session. Throughout this session we have taken forward our priorities as detailed in our school improvement plan. Through our processes of self-evaluation, we have identified how we can improve outcomes for our children and young people.

Our achievements and improvements this year.

We would like to highlight the following improvements/achievements:

Key developments – How we are leading change

- The school continues to benefit from 2 challenge leaders of learning (CLOs) who have successfully led the staff in developing approaches to literacy and numeracy.
- Pupil Equity Funding supported the continued appointment of a Principal Teacher and additional teaching hours for children.
- Children continue to lead through the Pupil Council, Rights Respecting Schools Committee and Eco Committee.
- Our Principal Teacher has continued to lead improvements in play in Primary 1 and Primary 2.
- One of our English as Additional Language Teachers has undertaken a programme called 'Improving our Classrooms' so she can better support developments in the school.

Developments in learning and teaching and assessment

- The school has developed its use of digital technologies so that teachers are using Seesaw to support learning in class and at home.
- Some teachers are using Sphero technology to support learning.
- Teachers are using Talk for Writing to support children's writing skills.
- Our English as an Additional Language teachers continue to support learners in making progress through English language levels, and have moved to a model of co-planning and co-teaching with class teachers.
- Strathclyde Business Students continue to work with us to support learning and teaching across the school and have enhance the support for a range of classes.
- Children benefited from Hidden Gardens outdoor learning experiences.
- We worked with Govanhill Baths to provide arts experiences such as making 'sound sculptures'.

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Progress in promoting well-being equality and inclusion

- A more comprehensive Health and Wellbeing programme has been developed and will be finalised in 2022-23.
- Children benefitted from With Kids Counselling for Primary 6 and Primary 7.
- Daisy Chain have worked with selected children from Primary 3 and Primary 4 in a small group to develop their health and wellbeing.
- We continue to work closely with the Speech and Language Service to provide high levels of in school support for children.
- Our Depute Headteacher continues to work closely with a range of partners including Social Work to ensure that families are supported in crisis.

Progress in children's learning /raising attainment and recognising achievement

- We worked closely with interpreters to ensure that communication with families is effective.
- Our Challenge Leaders of Learning have worked with groups of children to improve their attainment in literacy and numeracy.
- Our tracking of learning so that we can identify gaps in learning and progress levels is improving. We will consolidate this in 2022-23
- We continue to monitor attendance and late-coming, using Facebook to communicate with families.
- We introduced the end of year Margaret Miller Award to recognise one outstanding pupil who goes over and above in showing the school values.
- Our Primary 5 and Primary 6 made instruments for the 'Astar e lag' exhibition for Roma History Month.
- Romanolav have supported our children with Arts based experiences including displays of work in community spaces.
- Big Noise and Annette St Drummers have enhanced the music curriculum and given our children opportunities to perform in the community.

Here is what we plan to improve next year.

We will improve:

- Our Vision, Values and Aims, agreeing this with the whole school community
- Opportunities for pupils to have a voice and lead the school
- Leadership of the parent council
- Attendance and late-coming and how we monitor this
- The wearing of uniform and pride in the school as part of the community
- How we work with families to support learning at home, and report on learning
- Leadership of English as an Additional Language with teachers working more closely together
- How we plan for learning and provide for consistent approaches across classrooms
- Literacy and the teaching of reading across the school
- How we are including different cultures and languages in what we teach
- Our Health and Wellbeing programme including being a rights respecting school
