Priority 1: Raising Attainment through improving the quality of Learning and Teaching with a focus on Reading and Writing.

We successfully introduced the Read, Write Inc Phonics Programme across P1- P3, developing a more structured and systematic approach for the teaching of phonics in our infant department, leading to improved attainment in reading and writing at Early Level/Beginning of First Level.

- Our teaching team took part in Clicker training to improve our approaches to supporting writing through use of digital technologies. Most classes are now making use of Clicker to support individuals and groups of learners with their writing.
- All staff have continued to benefit from working with our Challenge Leader of Learning (Literacy) and our PT Raising Attainment Numeracy to further develop knowledge, confidence and skills with a specific focus on Writing Sentence building and descriptive bubbles to improve sentence structure and tools for writing.
- Our staff team engaged in Stephen Graham professional learning to improve writing pedagogy.
- We implemented the Read, Write, Inc Spelling Programme across P4- P7 to improve our approaches to teaching spelling rules and patterns, equipping pupils with strategies to help improve spelling knowledge and accuracy.

Our Achievements and Success in 2022 -23

Priority 2: Promoting Health and Wellbeing with a focus on improving social and emotional wellbeing for all and approaches to meeting learner needs with a focus on personalised

- We continued to develop and modify our Treehouse provision to support social, emotional and mental well-being for groups of identified learners.
- We extended our range of partnerships, to help improve our learning experiences for pupils requiring alternative curriculum. This included work with PEEK and Drumchapel Cycle Hub to help pupils develop essential life skills.
- A group of learners worked with Impact Arts as part our wellbeing provision.
- All staff used the Glasgow Wellbeing and Motivation Profile for all learners, to ensure accurate assessment and identify any necessary class/individual well-being supports.
- Staff received training on Fresh Start, a programme to support upper school children with a Dyslexia identification.
- We continued to embed our GDSS programmes and use of the Five-Minute Boxes to support groups of learners across the school.
- Two members of staff were trained in Seasons for Growth, a loss and bereavement programme to support targeted individuals.





Priority 3: Curriculum Development linked to Children's Rights, STEM, 2 plus 1 Languages and Drumchapel 70 project.

- We established Rights Respecting Ambassadors to help support our work on Children's Rights. Our elected 'Rights Knights' launched a Rights Mascot competition and gave regular input about Rights at our weekly assemblies. As a result of our work on this, the school received a Bronze Rights Committed Award.
- All learners across P1 -P7 received languages input as part of our non-class contact time programme. This ensured consistency across classes, with all children being exposed to both French and Spanish. Children also learned about the importance of learning a language and experienced some of the cultural aspects of these countries, including a very successful P6 French Café, visited by parents and carers.
- Our P7 classes successfully participated in the Glasgow Improvement Challenge Fem Eng Project that promotes the role of women in STEM. They also received workshops from Smart Stem Scotland.
- Our whole school participated in a range of activities to celebrate Drumchapel turning 70, including: a whole school show (Drumchapel across the decades, a Learning Community Writing competition and creating a special school Drumchapel turns 70 newspaper.

We received Green Flag status for our Eco work on recycling and looking after our local environment, recognising our achievements towards contributing to a more sustainable world.

We introduced our House System to promote our school values and develop opportunities for Pupil Leadership. All pupils got to participate in voting for their House Captains and Vice Captains.



Our P6 class successfully participated in Clyde in the Classroom Project, including visits to the Science Centre and taking responsibility for looking after fish in their own classroom.

Our whole school worked together to create a special D70 Show with every class performing songs from across the decades to celebrate Drumchapel's 70th Birthday.



Our P4 pupils participated as both contestants and the audience in the CBeebies Science Gameshow 'Get Set Galactic.' Great to see them on TV.

Our P5- P7 classes participated in visits to the City Chambers as part of the Glasgow City Council Parties campaign to promote Equalities, cultural diversity, tolerance and respect for all.

Our school choir were invited to sing at events across the city, including local performances at the Titan and local Care Homes.


