### Literacy and English

**Writing** - Children will focus on writing reports in a variety of meaningful contexts; this includes Chinese New Year, spring in Scotland and visiting Glasgow. We will continue to learn about ways to make our writing more interesting through adding exciting adjectives and verbs.

**Reading** - Children will read short stories in class and undertake follow up comprehension work to develop their reading skills. We will spend some time looking at Enid Blyton stories to promote reading for enjoyment. Towards the end of the term pupils can expect to learn about non-fiction; learning about how people lived in the past.

- **Listening & Talking** - Children will be given the opportunity to take part in the Scottish Poetry Competition.

### Numeracy and Mathematics

Children will develop knowledge and skills in different areas which include:

- Place Value - read and write 3-digit numbers and beyond
- Multiply & Divide: continue to build on multiplication facts
- Add & subtract - continue to work on tasks within 100 and move onto more difficult calculations for some of our learners - we will look to improve skills when working with more complicated algorithms for these pupils
- Money - making totals and finding change
- Time - using analogue clocks when telling the time to 5-minute intervals
- Fractions - identifying the fraction of a shape and ordering fractions
- Symmetry - Finding lines of symmetry
