Literacy and English

- **Writing** - reinforcing imagery within descriptions, developing sentence structure/ paragraphing and creating imaginative story based on a modelled text. Developing persuasive and discussion writing techniques through a range of text types.
- **Talking and Listening** - learn a Scottish poem and recite in front of their peers
- **Reading** - Using Nelson Comprehension to develop reading skills through classic fiction extracts and book/film blurbs. They will also be developing the reading skills of sequencing, finding similarities and differences as well as predicting.

Numeracy and Mathematics

- **Number**: developing division and multiplication skills, using square/cubed numbers. Applying addition and subtraction skills to solving multiple step word problems and decimals to 2 places. Ordering decimals, finding fractions of quantities and calculating 'best buys'
- **Maths**: Measuring and calculating angles. Exploring time including clock conversion and timetables. Building skills in measurement and shape, finding the perimeter of shapes, identifying 3D objects and their nets and reading scales.

Health and Wellbeing (including P.E days)

Interdisciplinary Learning
