<h3>Reading/Phonics</h3> <p>Read a story for enjoyment! Remember to use your reading strategies if you get stuck.</p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Look at the pictures• Sound it out• Word within a word	<h3>Writing</h3> <p>Have a go at writing a letter or writing a card for a friend or family member that you are looking forward to seeing. You could even send it to them if you have an envelope!</p> 	<h3>Listening and Talking</h3> <p>A variation on the traditional game of I-spy, using colours instead of letters e.g 'I spy with my little eye, something that is green'. Maximum of 3 guesses per item.</p> 
<h3>Numeracy</h3>  <p>Go on a number hunt around your house. Write down any numbers that you find. Try to create some number stories for the numbers that you have found e.g for the number 8 you could have 4+4, 6+2, 7+1</p>	<h3>Maths</h3> <p>Can you spot any symmetrical objects/items around your house or from the view of your window? Try and draw one or two of these!</p> 	<h3>Technology/Engineering</h3> <p>Build a robot using items that you have around your house. You could use Lego, old boxes for junk modelling, etc. Be inventive with your ideas!</p> 
<h3>Health and Wellbeing</h3> <p>Draw a cheerful picture to put on display at your window.</p> 	<h3>Play</h3>  <p>Use everyday household items for role play. An apron and silicone baking items to play 'restaurants', empty cereal boxes and milk bottles to play 'shopping' and a range of stuffed toys and a book to play 'teachers'.</p>	<h3>Family Learning</h3> <p>Get lots of soap in the washing up bowl and let the kids help! They love playing 'adult' so let them join in these domestic tasks and make it fun.</p> 



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
