
<u>DEAR - "Drop Everything and Read"</u>	Se creative Be creative	Alphabetical Order

The mole burst out of the ground because he was naughty. 2. The squirrel threw pine cones on Percy's head. 3. Squirrel remembered where her secret hiding place was. 4. Percy found the lost acorns. 5. The squirrel had to help Percy plant his bulbs before she could hide her acorns again.	(Acrostic Poem) Can you write an acrostic poem about spring? In an acrostic poem, the first letter of each line spells a word. I have done an example below. Have a go and share your poems! S unshine P lants growing R ainbows I nsects N ew life G reen grass	How many nouns can you see in the picture of the farm below? When we write a sentence, we can either put 'a' or 'the' before common nouns. Can you write out 6 of the nouns you see in the picture? e.g. a cow, the sun Can you use these nouns in a sentence? *Challenge* - Think of another place and see how many nouns you can think of for that place. (e.g. the park – trees, bench etc.)You could set a timer or play in teams against each other?

Our story study this week is about missing things. Talk with someone at home about the sort of things that can get lost (keys, pets, socks, teeth!)	Stage One: ng words (as in thi ng and stri ng) Stage Two: ow words (as in sn ow and bl ow)	Try playing Nougats and Crosses with the common words. Choose two words for each game, for example replace nougats with 'yellow' and crosses with 'again'.

Can you think of anymore words that contain your phoneme? Choose 4 phoneme words and try to write an interesting sentence for each.
