Critical comment on the photography

- Photography is really poor, amateurish, breathtaking, incredible, impressive

Your opinion on acting/performance

- Wooden, appalling, natural, powerful, spectacular, (un)convincing, believable, likeable

Your opinion on writing/script

- confusing, realistic, thought-provoking, compelling, moving, contrived, hilarious

Conclusions, general impression, personal recommendation

- Generally I find this film absolutely fascinating

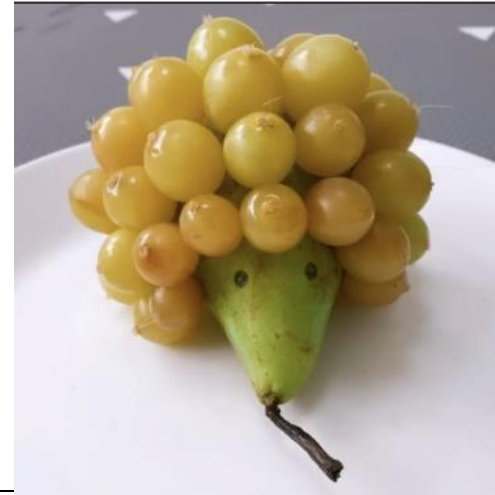

What's going on this week?



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A mother from Northumberland recently spent £100 on a second-hand vending machine to provide an opportunity for her children to learn about money after tiring of them arguing over snacks and other items during lockdown. Mother of four, Sarah Balsdon, was getting so fed up with her children's constant arguments she and her husband, Kyle, came up with the idea to provide them in a limited and controlled way, whilst helping the children learn how to manage money.

Main question:
