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Supporting Improvement: **Standards and Quality Report**



Battlefield Primary School

The summary report is provided for parents/carers and partners to outline our achievements this session and our priorities for next session. Throughout this session we have taken forward our priorities as detailed in our school improvement plan. Through our processes of self-evaluation, we have identified how we can improve outcomes for our children and young people.

Our achievements and improvements this year.

We would like to highlight the following improvements/achievements made during session 2021/2022:

1. Health & Well-Being & Recovery

Our focus on health & wellbeing for all continues to improve outcomes in mental health & well-being. All staff were trained in the use of the Emotion Works resource to provide universal support for all classes. Nurture staff have utilised these resources to support targeted individuals and groups. Children are now more confident in both identifying and expressing their feelings and are able to adopt strategies to cope with these. Partnership working with Life Link counsellors and play therapy enabled us to offer individual support where required. Outdoor Learning continues to be a key feature in teaching & learning across the school with all classes receiving teaching and learning experiences in this area. Our new outdoor library/classroom will continue to support the delivery of outdoor learning experiences in subsequent years.

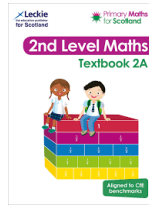


2. Raising Attainment in Literacy & Numeracy

Significant progress has been made in the development of Literacy. All staff have been trained in the use of Single Word Spelling Tests to identify and plan for gaps in learning. We have introduced Wordshark, to support pupils in the development of their spelling. All staff are now introducing Reading Strategies and have new Literacy Circle packs to support the teaching of reading. Our new core reading scheme, Big Cats will ensure we are supporting diversity and equality and we have introduced Phonic Readers to further support children where required. In Numeracy all staff are delivering Glasgow Counts strategies and Number Talks to develop the problem solving and reasoning skills of learners. All staff are using Word Aware approaches to develop high levels of confidence in Numeracy and Maths vocabulary amongst our learners while helping to ensure consistency across stages. All staff are supported in Numeracy & Mathematics by our new Primary

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Maths for Scotland resource enabling more effective planning and delivery of lessons. All staff continue to develop their classrooms to meet the needs of both dyslexic & English as Additional Language (EAL) learners. Cluster working has enabled us to further develop our approaches to meeting learners needs. Our EAL teacher has made significant developments to the identification of and planning for our EAL learners to enable all staff to meet learners needs more effectively. Cluster working has led to a joint Additional Support Needs policy to further support our learners. All staff were trained in the CIRCLE Framework enabling them to effectively identify and then meet learners needs.



3. Vision, values and aims

We have selected our new school values this year – **HONESTY, RESPONSIBILITY, ECO FRIENDLY, KINDNESS, RESPECT**. We are now celebrating and embedding these values through weekly assemblies, certificates and tea parties for children 'living' our values. During Time to Talk sessions children are able to demonstrate their understanding of our values.



4. Diversity & Equalities and Children's Rights

All staff continue to support diversity and equality across the school and our new Equalities and Diversity policy formulated through whole school consultation sets out our vision and the roles and responsibilities for all in promoting Equality and Diversity. Time to Talk sessions allow children to regularly discuss their opinions on Equality, Diversity and Children's Rights.



Here is what we plan to improve next year.

Our whole school staff will be working with the West Partnership on the 'Improving Our Classrooms' programme; This aims to:

- Improve approaches to high quality learning and teaching
- Improve attainment and achievement for all
- Support effective use of data analysis to support learners
